Members Present: Alderpersons Mark Weix, Michael Caylor and Mike Rick (remote)

Others present in person or remote: City Clerk Anderson-Malm, City Attorney Hayden, Fire Chief Klug, Police Chief Bennett, Building Inspector/Zoning Administrator Pagel, Alderperson Lupton and Merrill Productions. Deputy Health Office Ashbeck was excused

- I. Chair Weix called the meeting to order at 5:15 p.m.
- II. **Minutes from the March 27th, 2023 meeting:**
Alderperson Caylor motioned to place the minutes from March 27, 2023 meeting on file. Chair Weix seconded and the motion carried.
- III. **Nuisance Complaints & Vouchers:**
 1. **Nuisance Complaints** – Building Inspector/Zoning Administrator Pagel reported on the nuisance complaints that were in the agenda packet.
 2. **Vouchers** – Alderperson Rick motioned to approve the vouchers. Alderperson Caylor seconded and the motion carried.
- IV. **General Agenda Items:**
 1. **Consider three temporary Class “B” picnic licenses for the Lincoln County Rodeo Association for June 9, 10 and 11, 2023.**
Alderperson Caylor made a motion to approve the three temporary Class “B” picnic licenses for the Lincoln County Rodeo Association for June 9, 10 and 11, 2023 and forward it to the May Common Council. Alderperson Rick seconded and the motion carried.
 2. **Discuss and consider an Ordinance amending Chapter 26, Article V, Section 26-134 Habitual Truancy**
City Attorney Hayden spoke about this request and the reason for amending the Ordinance. Following a brief discussion, Alderperson Caylor made a motion to approve this change and forward this to the May Common Council. Chair Weix seconded and the motion carried.
 3. **Discussion on deer population within the city and possible solutions.**
Police Chief Bennett discussed this issue and the possible solutions. He spoke with the DNR for possible solutions within the city limits. Discussion occurred between the committee members. Chair Weix requested deer crossing signs by Hwy K, Riverside Ave and Joe Snow as a caution for motorists. It was also suggested by South State St, Taylor Street and Grand Avenue/Hwy 107 for other signs. No action was taken and this will be placed on the August agenda for further discussion.

4. **Continued discussion regarding pool fills and potential rate increases:**

Chair Weix reviewed the previous discussion regarding this subject and stated Alderperson Caylor had a liability concern. Alderperson Caylor suggested the rate increase should be discussed in Personnel & Finance due to the financial aspect. Fire Chief Klug handed out additional information at the meeting and stated this service was added about 4 years ago.

It was suggested this service could be limited to city limits. Alderperson Caylor stated the rural fire service contracts for the Town of Rock Falls, Scott and Merrill have not been negotiated. The question was brought up for discussion as to why would the city offer this service if the above mentioned towns will not negotiate for rural fire service. No action was taken.

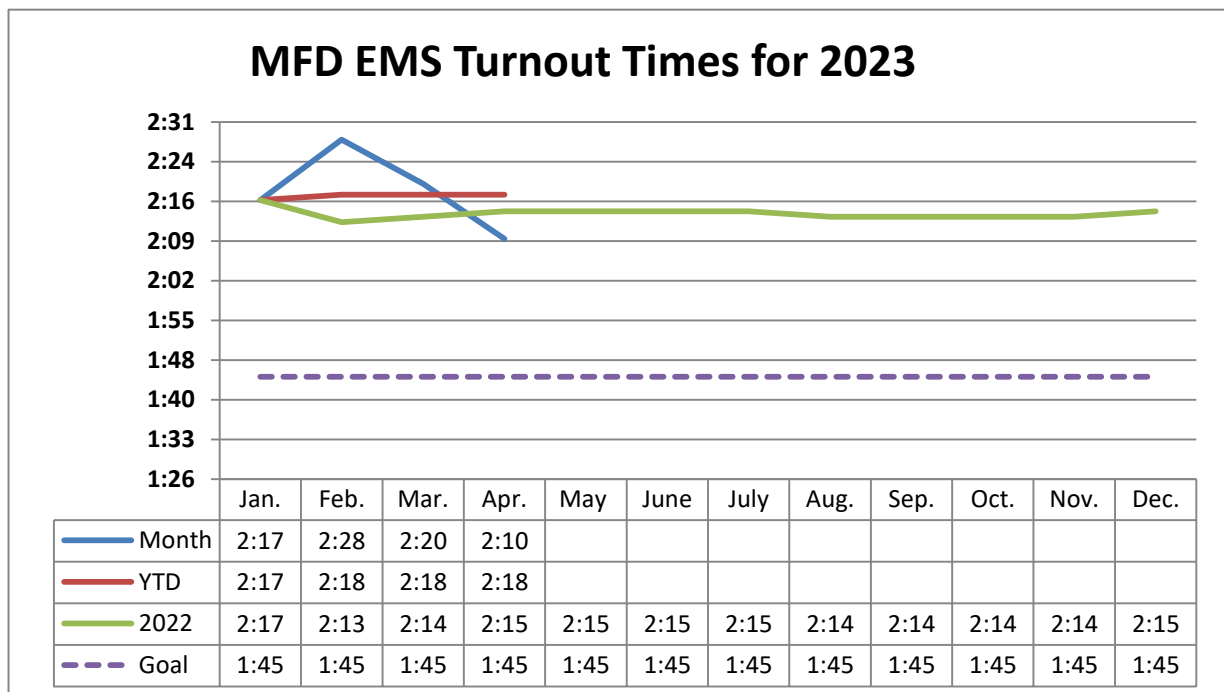
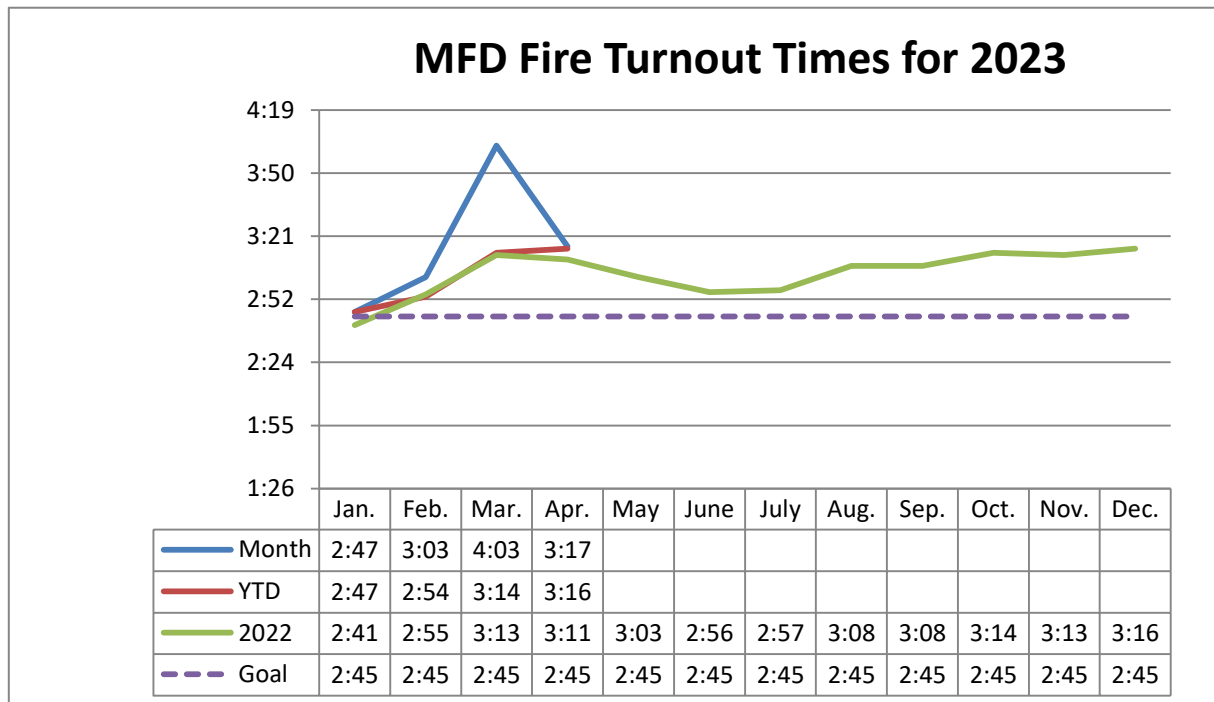

2022

2022 brought its fair share of significant changes to the Merrill Fire Department. Of most significance was the change in personnel and staffing. We started the year with four Battalion Chiefs (BCs) and 106 years of combined experience, but finished the year with only three BCs and 62 years of experience. Even with the huge loss, the year was not all negative. We hired the first full-time female firefighter in our department's 135 year history. We also had received some sizable grants too. Finally, the city settled a collective bargaining contract with Local 847. There is nothing stagnant in the fire service including what happened in our own department.

Here is the chronological breakdown of important administrative and fire department events that occurred in 2022:



February – Chief Klug testified at state capitol on bill AB 874 which will require DHS to participate in federal Medicare reimbursement program. Reimbursement will significantly improve ambulance funding statewide and in Lincoln County would result in over \$240,000 more revenue annually.



February 26 - Merrill Firefighter Charities (union) hosted the 1st Annual Winter Wonderland Charity Ball at the Northwood's VFW. They raised over \$12,000 on the one day event.



April 29 – Hosted retirement ceremony for Firefighter/Paramedic Chris Marion. He served from 1994 – 2017, but his career was cut short by a freak water ski accident that prevented him from returning to work. A ceremony was finally held to celebrate his career and service to the Merrill community.



September 23 – We received \$69,000 grant from the Wisconsin Department of Health Services as part of a one-time, EMS flex grant. The grant will be used to purchase EMS supplies for first responder bags, equipment for ambulances, a high-tech manikin simulator, and a new EMS sked unit for our rescue UTV.



October 28 – Retirement ceremony for Battalion Chief Scott Krause. He served the department faithfully for 32 years. He upgraded to paramedic in 2006 when the department advanced to that level. He later oversaw the EMS Division and was responsible for a host of improvements throughout his career.



October 31 – Firefighter/Paramedic Kendall Nelson is hired as 189th member of the Merrill Fire Department. She also becomes the first fulltime female employee of our department. Nelson has previously served with the Mosinee Fire District, Tomahawk Fire Department, and Tomahawk EMS.



November 8 – We received \$90,000 grant from the Bierman Family Foundation to replace firefighter turnout gear and beds at the fire station. Once again generous donations like this allow our staff to receive the best equipment available and saves taxpayers money.



December 12 –City council unanimously approved CBA with IAFF Local 847. The previous contract expired December 31, 2021.



December 28 – Promotion ceremony for Battalion Chief John Kraegenbrink. With the retirements of Wegener & Krause, Kraegenbrink was selected to fill one of the vacant positions. He will oversee the training division. He started with the department in 2002.

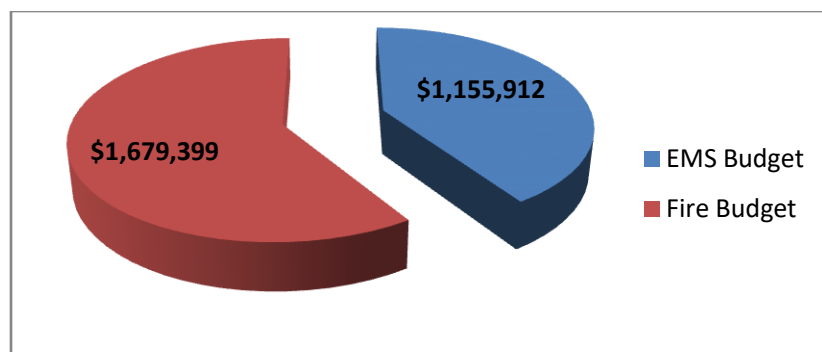


December 28– Retirement ceremony for Battalion Chief Tadd Wegener. He served the department faithfully for 32 years. He oversaw the Apparatus Maintenance Division and was a Juvenile Firesetter Counselor. Prior to his service at MFD, he served in the United States Air Force.

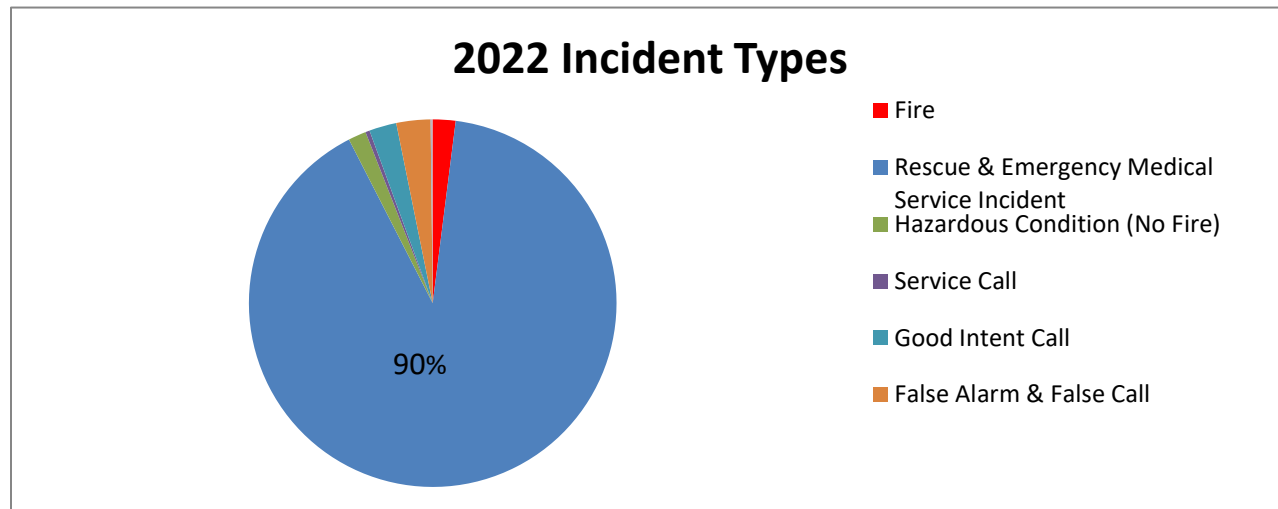
The total 2022 expenditure budget for the Merrill Fire Department was \$2,835,311 while the actual year end total of expenditures was \$2,940,392. The ambulance budget was approximately \$27,000 over budget, but that overage is covered by the county through terms of the contract. The fire budget was almost \$64,000 over budget. Overages from both budgets was primarily caused with increases to wages and benefits. Additionally, vehicle maintenance on the fire budget and supplies on the ambulance budget were contributing factors in the overages.

Even though we were significantly over budget in 2022, the collaboration of pooling financial resources together through the ambulance contract and rural fire contracts promotes the most effective and efficient use of resources in the Merrill community. As noted in previous annual reports, there has been no change to the city and county ambulance agreement since 2008. Additionally, the rural fire contract with the Towns of Merrill, Rock Falls, and Scott has not changed. The contract automatically renews each year if no successor agreement has been reached. The towns collectively continue to pay \$221,899 annually for fire and rescue protection. This amount has not changed since 2019.

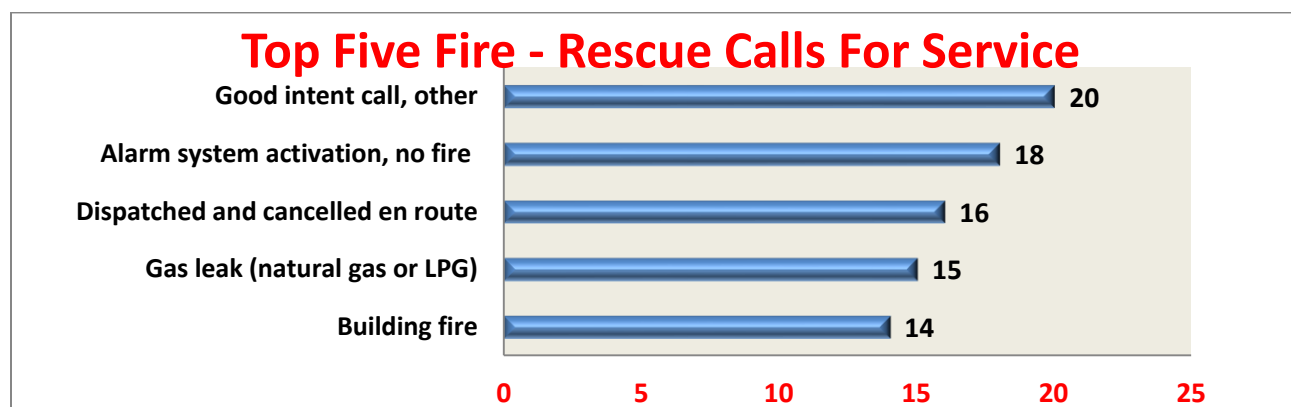

The pie chart below illustrates that 90% of our call volume last year was EMS and rescue incidents. This is typical for career fire departments that run EMS calls. This percentage is similar to 2021.

People definitely take notice. In 2022 and in future years, we will acknowledge the lows, but we will also celebrate and recognize the highs.

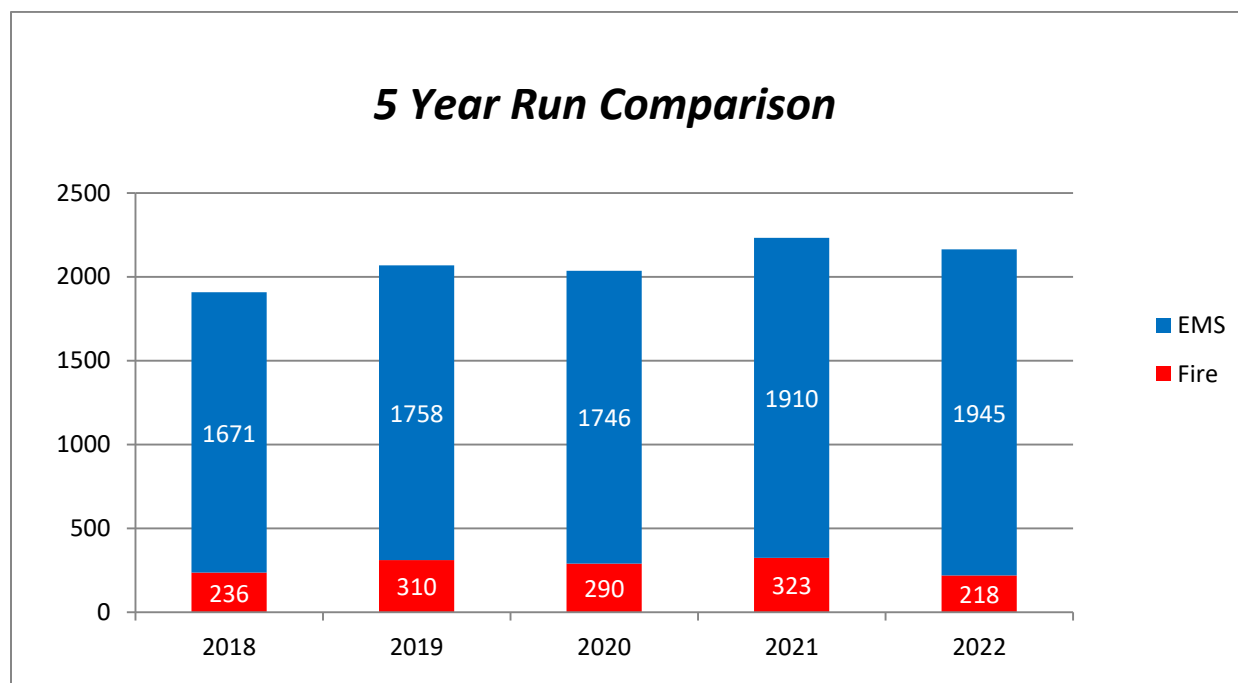
2022

2022 was another busy year for the Merrill Fire Department. The Merrill Fire Department responded to 2,163 calls for service based on the National Fire Incident Reporting System (NFIRS). EMS continued to



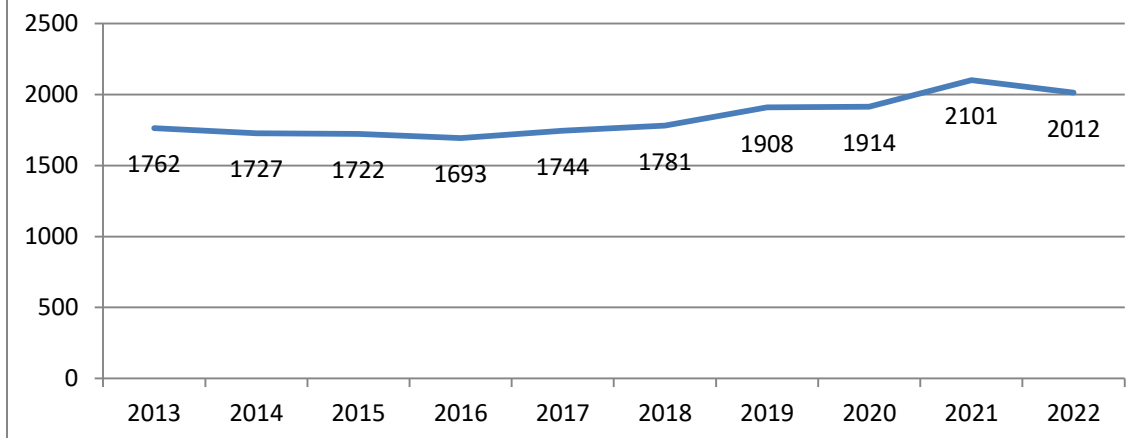
account for a majority of our call volume with 1945 EMS related calls for service (90%). Following will be a graph that depicts our run volume. We also have a separate EMS report where our EMS run numbers are higher. This is because on the EMS side for the state, we need to have a run report for each patient we are in contact with. An example is a 2 vehicle MVA with 2 patients. This would generate 1 call for service for the National Fire Incident Reporting System (NFIRS) on the fire side, but 2 EMS runs in the Wisconsin Ambulance Run Data System (WARDS).

5 Year Run Comparison



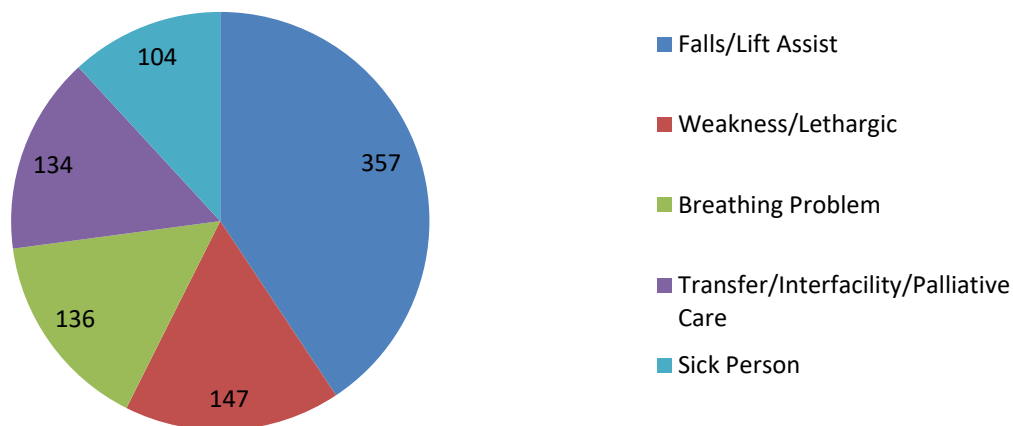
In 2022 we had 2,012 EMS requests for service. Of these we transported 1,313 patients (about 65%). A majority of the patients (50.35%) were transported to Aspirus Merrill Hospital. We do transport to other area hospitals also depending on the nature of the call, i.e. a cardiac patient might bypass Merrill and be brought directly to Wausau Hospital. The remaining calls (about 700) patients did not require transport for various reasons such as they may have refused care, went by other means, or no patient found. As paramedics, when on scene care is given by staff many times it results in patients not needing to be transported to the hospital too.

2022 Total calls based on EMS reporting



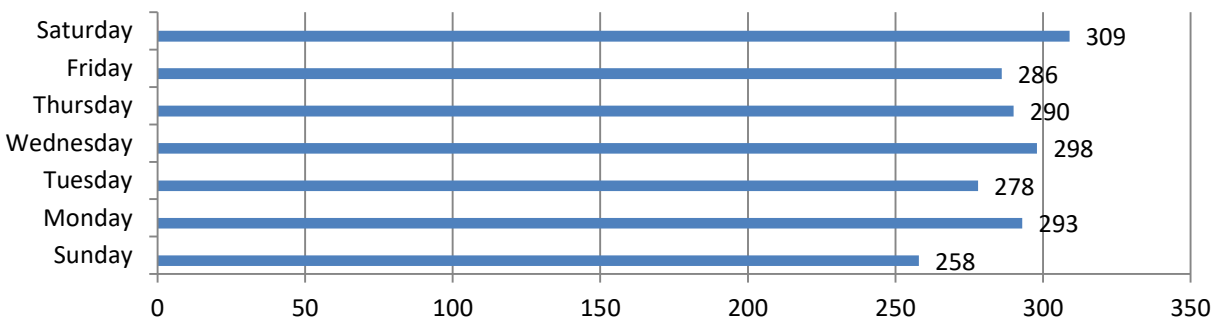
Falls were responsible for 357 or 17.74% of the 2,012 EMS calls the Merrill Fire Department was dispatched to in 2022. The top five reasons for dispatch are noted on the chart below. Combined, the top five reasons for dispatch accounted for over 43.6% of all 2022 EMS calls. No other dispatch reason accounted for more than 5% of the total dispatch reasons for EMS calls in 2022. These calls (about 46% all together) consist of seizures, strokes, cardiac, diabetics, fevers, headache, and pain to name a few of the reasons.

Our busiest month was December with 205 calls with the 2 busiest days of the week in 2022 being Saturday and Wednesday. The busiest time of the day for EMS calls were between 1pm and 2pm which accounted for 136 calls out of the 2012 EMS calls.

EMS calls by Day of the Week

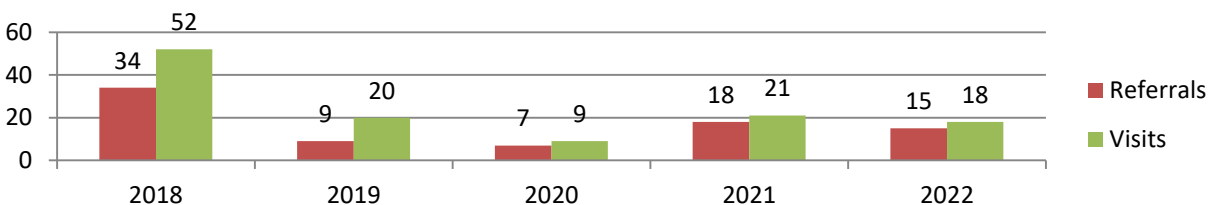


EMS runs for 2022 included 15 Community Paramedicine Program referrals with a total of 18 patient visits. The Community Paramedicine Program is collaboration between Aspirus Merrill Hospital and the Merrill Fire Department to provide a follow up visit for certain diagnoses such as COPD, CHF, Pneumonia, and COVID. Diabetes was added to this program in late 2022 based on data from Aspirus Merrill Hospital showing an upward trend of diabetics being seen in the ED for complications related to diabetes.

The Community Paramedicine Program is totally voluntary and many of the patients that were referred to this program had no home healthcare or nursing available to them. This program bridges the gap between being discharged from the hospital and patient's being seen by their primary care provider and to provide a visit to ensure that these patients are on the road to recovery.

Previous years showed a decline due to the COVID Pandemic. In 2022 there was a transition of ownership of the hospital from Ascension to Aspirus. With the transition there have been a few changes within Aspirus Merrill Hospital and with that transition we have seen a decrease in the amount of referrals and visits to this program. We continue to work with Aspirus Merrill Hospital on increasing and improving on this program in the future.

Community Paramedicine Visits by Year



With 2022 behind us and the Merrill fire Department starting to offer American Heart CPR and First Aid classes again it was a busy year in 2022. Our 3 CPR instructors Daylan Enkers, Eric Trempe, and Dylan Schielke taught a total of 48 classes in 2022 with 190 students receiving training. In 2022 a majority (70%) took the online class offered by the American Heart Association with a skill test out session observed by one of the CPR Instructors. This is a very popular option for various reasons. For those that felt more comfortable taking an in person class we were able to accommodate the business or organizations needs by teaching a total of 14 times throughout the year. We will continue to offer this service in 2023 as it is one of our more popular prevention activities.

Below are the significant EMS events that happened in 2022:

- February 2022- Personnel provided training on the use of the Handtevy app and associated equipment to prepare and provide correct medication dosing and assorted equipment for the pediatric patient up to a full grown adult. This app also allows personnel to quickly find and view our protocols through the app.
- April 2022- SOG M-14 regarding transport of patient's back to residences released from care of Aspirus Merrill Hospital. The Merrill Fire Department discontinued transports of patient's back to their homes with the exception of authorize facilities that have a signed agreement and Hospice patients.
- May 2022- The Merrill Fire Department discontinued blood pressure checks at Park Place. Stonebridge and Jenny Towers due to low participation numbers.
- August 2022- Through a grant from the North Central Trauma Advisory Council we were able to purchase and distribute Stop the Bleed Kits to organizations and businesses that have Public Access Defibrillators. Through this distribution we were able to offer in person classes to those who requested additional training.
- October 2022- The new Horton ambulance that was ordered in 2020 is now under construction.

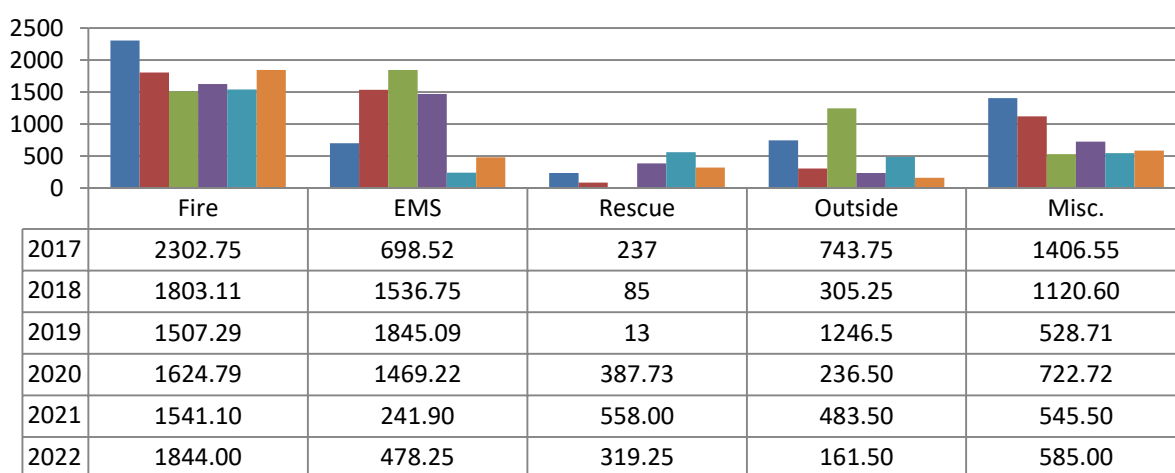

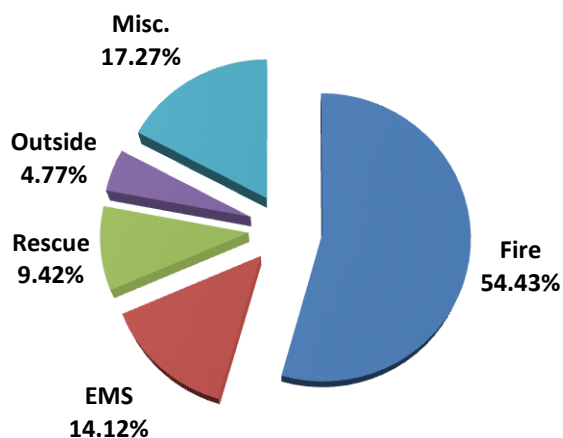
Training allows us to prepare for situations that we are called to on a less frequent basis. With new strategies and tactics on how to extinguish fires to new and safer ways to operate new equipment, training is the way we hone our skills. Through our fire prevention efforts the numbers of fires are down but, our skills must remain sharp. The philosophy of going back to the basics was this year's theme for training.

As an organization personnel completed 3,388 hours of training for 2022. Below is a breakdown of hours spent and percentages of training offered to crews and highlights of training performed in 2022.

2022 Training Highlights

In January we welcomed Jennifer Cramer from the Firefighter Behavioral Health Alliance for a workshop regarding mental health issues in emergency services. We had a great showing of active and retired personnel that attended this workshop. In the evening Jennifer then presented another workshop to the spouses and significant others of our personnel. This training was funded by the Sawmill Brewing Company's annual Race to the Taps charity event.



Each crew was able to take advantage of our biannual Hazardous Materials Operations level refresher training. This training was taught by Nicolet College instructors and many of the instructors are also members of the Oneida County Hazardous Materials Team. This allowed our staff to operate and interact with the Oneida County Hazmat members as they are the contracted Hazardous Material Team for Lincoln County. This training was part of a Hazardous Materials training grant obtained by Lincoln County's Emergency Management Director September Murphy.



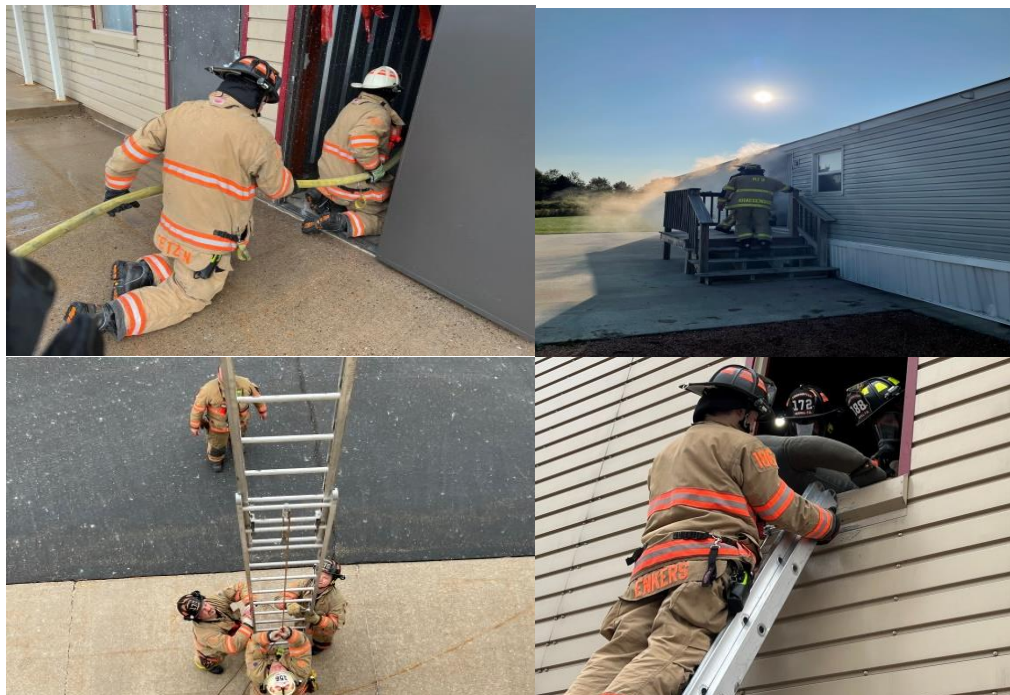
One way to train is from learning from problems that happen on the fire ground. This is accomplished by reviewing NIOSH Line of Duty Death reports and placing personnel in scenario based situations. The drill pictured to the right is a drill based off of a 1995 incident in Pittsburg, PA where 3 firefighters lost their lives. This drill tests the limitations of the group and each member in a number of ways including fatigue, stress, communication, timing and critical thinking and pushes the group to prove its ability to rescue a fellow firefighter.



In July each crew was able to go through elevator fire service operations and elevator rescue training at Park Place, Jenny Towers, and Stonebridge. All crews received training in the proper steps to perform an elevator rescue for a victim that is in the elevator when the elevator is stuck between floors. This included locating of the elevator door keys to access the victim. This was a joint effort between the Merrill Fire Department and the Merrill Housing Authority.



In 2022 personnel had several opportunities to train at the North Central Technical College's Public Safety Center of Excellence. As mentioned above it was back to basics in which this year's topics were ground ladder use, search and rescue, and hose deployment.



Certifications

Listed below are the State of Wisconsin Certifications received by personnel in 2022:

- FF/PM Dylan Schielke obtained his National Incident Management 300 certification
- FF/PM Jacob Aumann received his certification as a Certified Motor Pump Operator-Pumper
- FF/PM Josh Grovogel attained State of Wisconsin Certified Fire Investigator. FF/PM Grovogel is one of the first to obtain this new certification

In 2023 we will continue to challenge and develop our personnel by challenging them both mentally and physically through training. We have consistently exceeded the minimum standards set forth by SPS 330 the State of Wisconsin standard for minimum training required on a yearly basis.

Public Education Division

2022

In 2022, the Merrill Fire Department reached out in a variety of ways to provide public education and training to fulfill our Mission Statement of Preventing harm, Preserving life and Protecting property. The Merrill Fire Department is committed to being involved with members of the community in all age groups to provide valuable information in regards to the prevention of fires and other emergencies along with what to do in the event of an emergency. The department also takes great pride in our ability to work with businesses, individuals and other organizations to give back to the community during the holidays and in times of need throughout the year.

The Tree of Hope



In 2022 the "Tree of Hope" program provided 140 families with a total of 375 children much needed clothing, bedding, personal hygiene supplies and gifts for the Christmas Season. The fire department works closely with the Christmas Spirit of Lincoln County to locate and organize families in need throughout Lincoln County. For the fire department giving out toys at Christmas began in 1941 at which time firefighters would repair donated broken toys to give to local children. The days of fixing old toys no longer exists; however, it is with the generosity of local businesses, organizations and individuals that ensure a happy holiday season for residents of Lincoln County.

Smoke detector installs



The Merrill Fire Department in conjunction with the American Red Cross offered smoke detectors to community members that reside in the Merrill Fire Department coverage area which include the City and Town of Merrill, Town of Scott and a portion of the Town of Rock Falls. Individuals that call about the program are offered up to 3 smoke detectors. Members of the department will go to the homes and install the detectors along with reviewing a home safety checklist. In 2022, 12 households received new smoke detectors with a total of 30 detectors being sold.

Community Night Out



This is an annual event hosted by the Merrill Fire and Police Departments. The event is held at the Bierman Building & Merrill Festival Grounds. Emergency responders along with other agencies and organizations meet and answer questions from the public. Community booths are setup inside the Bierman Building while vehicles and larger equipment are displayed on the Festival Grounds. The overall goal behind this event is to help build a stronger relationship between the citizens and local agencies that serve them. In 2022 approximately 200 citizens of all ages attended this event.



Public Education: CPR, 1st Aid and AED training

In the event of a cardiac arrest it is paramount that an immediate call to 911 along with bystander CPR is initiated which can be the difference between life and death. The department has taught numerous citizens from all backgrounds the steps in performing high quality CPR for a number of years. This year we were able to teach 190 individuals the proper steps in performing life saving measures prior to emergency responders arriving at their location. A number of local businesses have their employees trained in CPR and the use of an AED. These skills are taught by one of the 3 American Heart Association certified instructors from the department. The American Heart Association has also started an online version for community members to complete at which time the individuals contact the station and set up a time to demonstrate and be evaluated by a CPR instructor prior to receiving their CPR certification.

Keep the Wreath Green



The "Keep The Wreath Green Campaign" was started in the early 1980's and continues to be an annual program that is a visual reminder for the community about the need for increased fire safety precautions during the holidays. This program starts on Thanksgiving Day and goes through New Year's Day. This tally is for areas covered by the fire department which include the City of Merrill, Town of Scott, Town of Merrill and southern portion of the Town of Rock Falls. The wreath starts out with all green bulbs and for every structure fire in that timeframe 1 green bulb is replaced with a red bulb. The wreath ended up with 3 red bulbs in 2022. The white bulb and blue bulb are in honor of fallen firefighters and law enforcement officers.

Stop the Bleed

The "Stop the Bleed Campaign" is a program designed to teach citizens the important lifesaving steps on how to initially treat life threatening hypotensive shock due to major hemorrhaging. With the increased potential of violence in the community or even day to day dangers these lessons are invaluable when it comes to immediate treatment prior to emergency service arrival. The department has also tried to coordinate with local businesses that currently have AED's in place to provide 1 of these kits to be placed in or near their AED cabinet which would make it easily accessible in the event of a cardiac or trauma related incident.



Fire Prevention Education in Schools

In 2022 the department visited 8 different educational facilities to teach school age children from Pre-K to 5th grade important fire safety information that is designed for each age group. The take home exercises handed out during these events are intended to not only teach the children but also get the parents involved as they sit down with the child to complete the assignments. This is a great opportunity for everyone in the home to discuss what actions need to be taken in a fire emergency which include but not limited to calling 911, having a designated meeting place, knowing 2 ways out of the home, having working smoke detectors, not going back into the home for anything and practicing their fire escape plan.

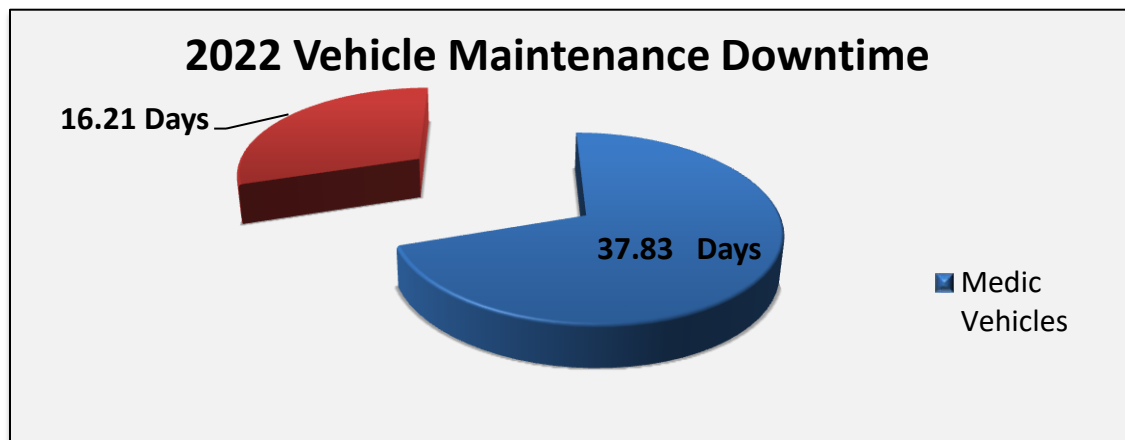

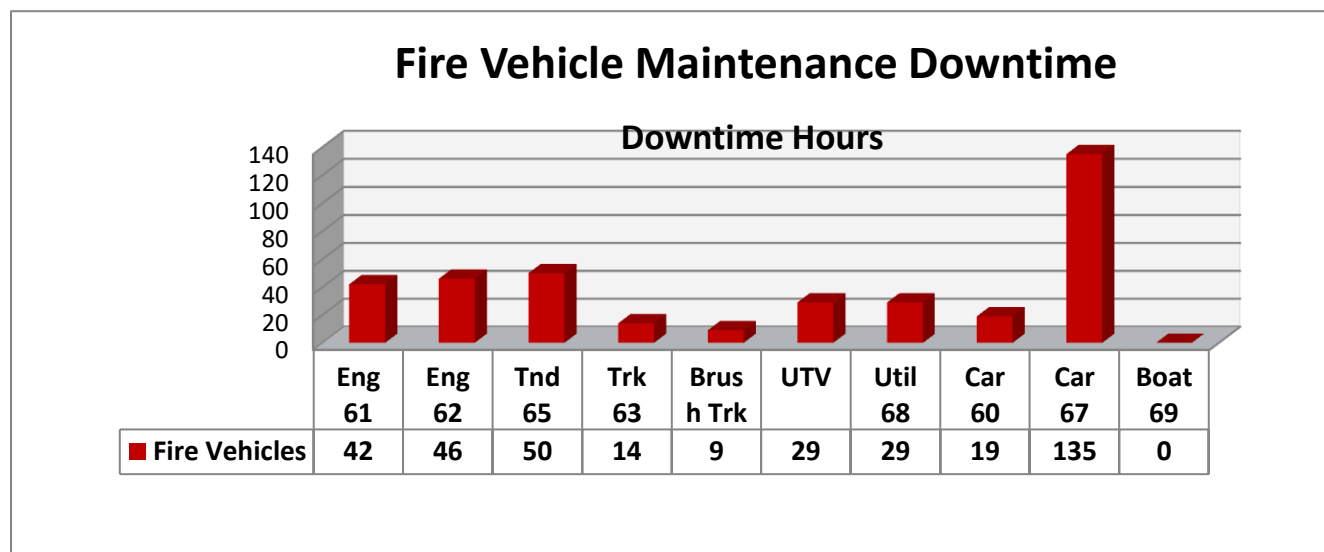
Apparatus Maintenance Division

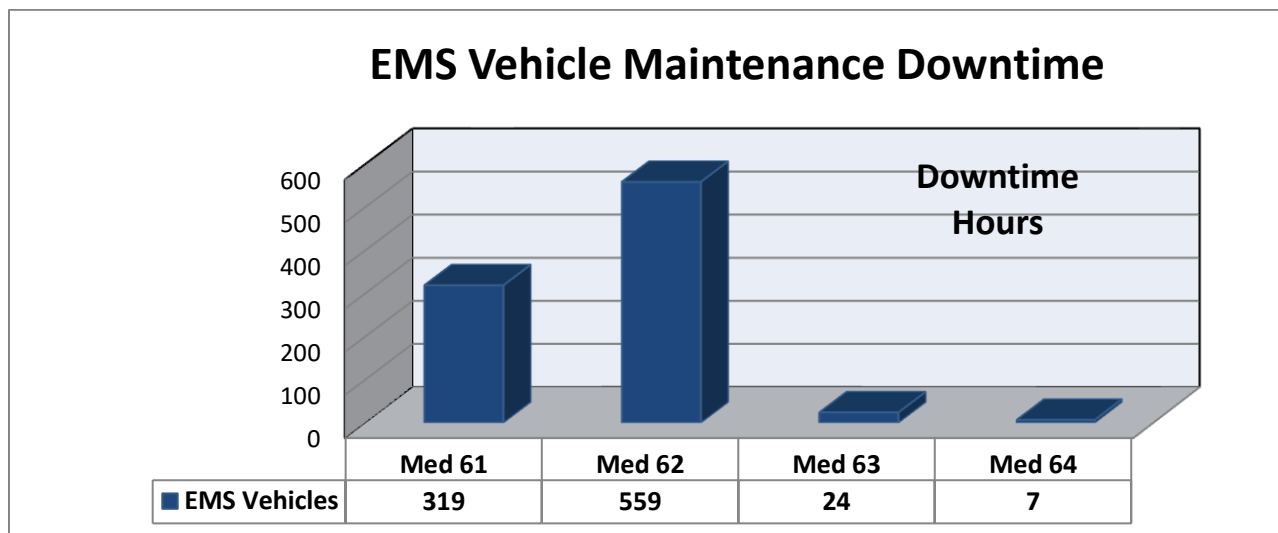

As the Battalion Chief in charge of the Vehicle Maintenance Division, it is my goal to ensure that all apparatus driven, engines pumped and associated equipment utilized is in working order and safe to use under emergency situations. As in the past we have relied on the Merrill City Garage to perform our vehicle maintenance. We are fortunate to have ASE qualified mechanics to perform maintenance on all of our vehicles. They are able to do DOT annual vehicle inspections, preventive maintenance, routine maintenance and in dire need after hours assistance.



A very important facet of tracking our vehicles maintenance needs is when a vehicle is fueled at the city fuel pumps the engine hours are entered and the Fleet Maintenance computer system (Pubworks) software identifies the need for work based on those hours. Another vital part to the (Pubworks) is when the need for maintenance is found in-house we submit a maintenance request via E-mail on an established form and follow it up with a call to city garage if the work needs to be expedited. Merrill Fire Department has four pieces of apparatus that have onboard fire pumps that do require annual testing in order to comply with National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) regulations. We have North Star Emergency Vehicle Maintenance conduct this certified testing. Not only does this test satisfy the requirement for pump testing, it also is a very thorough inspection of the vehicle. If problems or preventative maintenance is required it is determined if it can be accomplished at the city garage or if it requires an outside contractor to fix it.





On the same note of having our fire pumps annually tested, we are required to have our fire ladders to include the 100' aerial tested each year as per NFPA. If any of the ladders that we possess are exposed to either flame impingement or damage they must be taken out of service and replaced with a certified one in its place.

Merrill Fire Department also possesses numerous small engines that require maintenance as required according to manufacturer's recommendations. These items are: chain saws, generators and specialized ventilation saws.

Dustin Bonack has been the street Commissioner for 6 years now and he and his support staff have been instrumental in keeping us in the high state of readiness they we have cultivated over the years. Thank you to: Melissa-Admin assistant, Bob and Mike the mechanics.

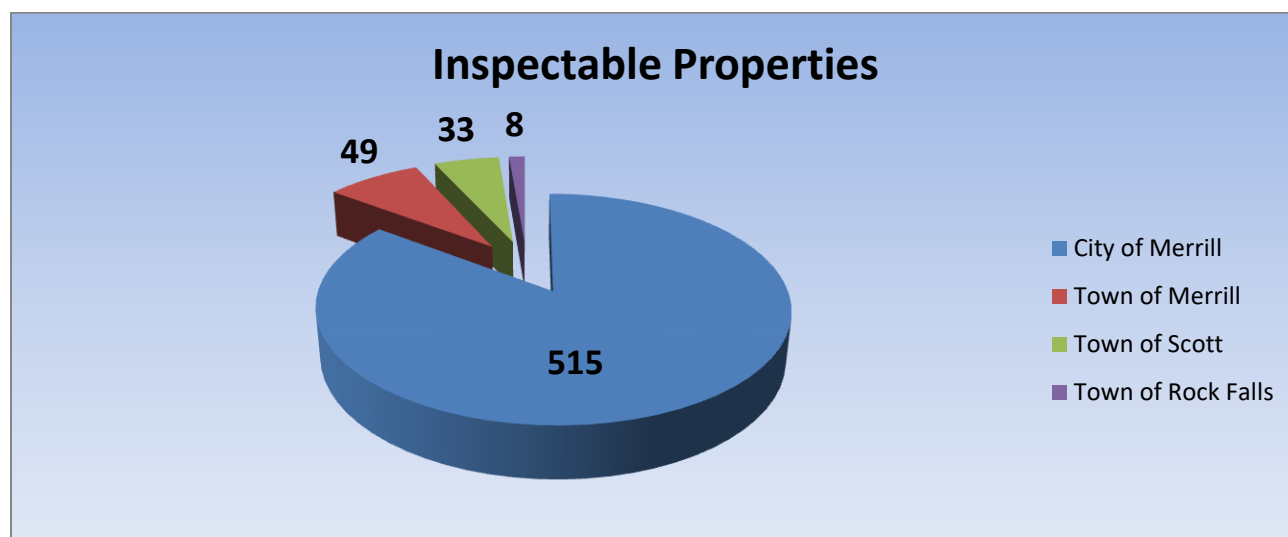

Merrill Fire Department Fire Inspector, Joe Bozinski, assisted business owners in obtaining compliance with fire code requirements to reduce the risk of an emergency occurring. The types of buildings inspected were businesses, factories, restaurants, churches, schools, senior citizen housing, and other buildings that could pose significant risks to its occupants or the public.



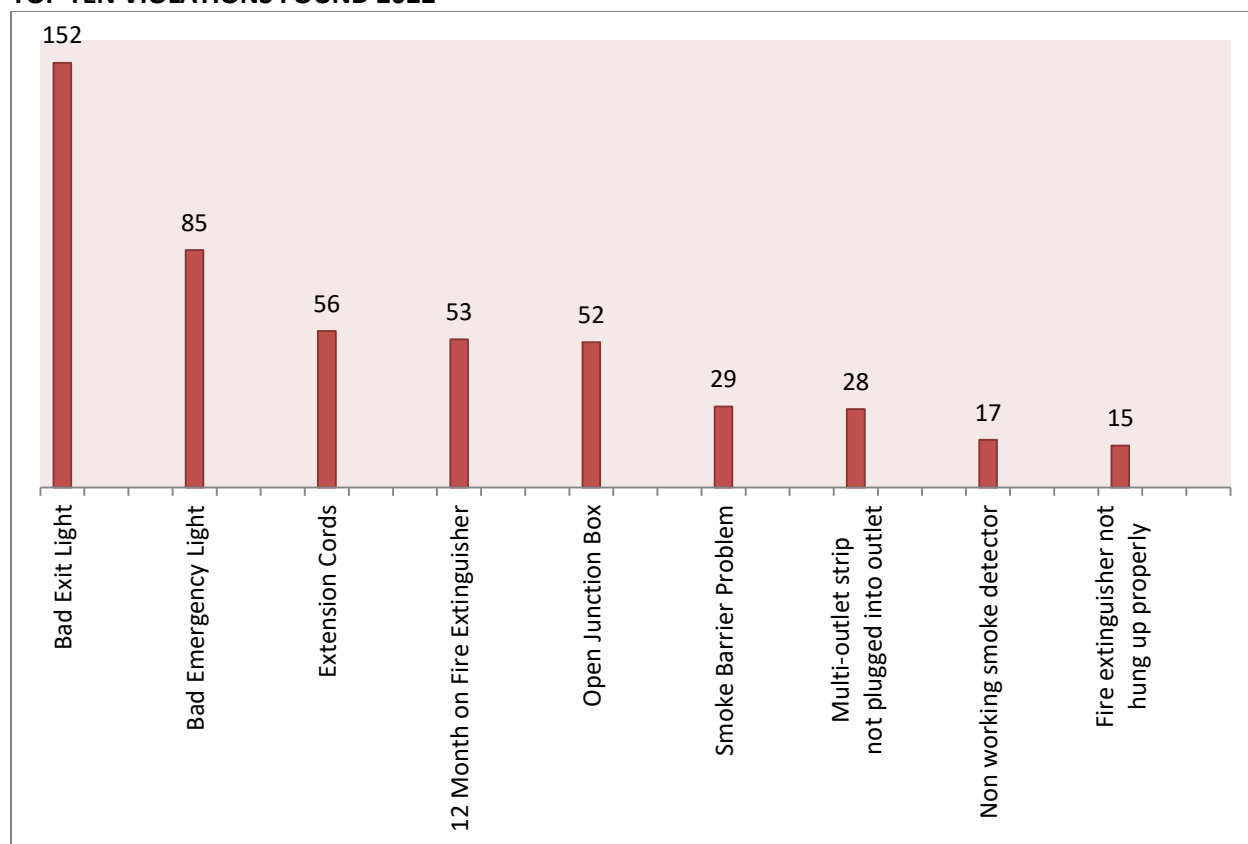
Inspections focus on discovering and correcting conditions likely to cause a fire or life safety hazard. The majority of inspections completed were routine fire prevention inspections, however other inspections included:

- Occupancy Inspections (New Construction)
- Life Safety System Acceptance (Alarm and Fire Sprinklers)
- Complaint Inspections
- Lincoln County Fair food vendors, festival grounds, related buildings and amusement vendors
- Residential inspections for Foster Care licensing
- Startup assistance with new business in relation to fire prevention

Inspections continue to be conducted on six months intervals. Inspection efforts in 2022 resulted in:

- 959 inspections performed
- 605 occupancies
- 696 violations corrected
- 138 re-inspections.
- 43 Different violations found

TOP TEN VIOLATIONS FOUND 2022



Problems with exit and emergency lights again top the list of violations found. Usually the problem is a result of bad backup batteries.

Merrill fire continues following the plan of having one employee dedicated to inspections to provide a consistent interpretation of the codes and enables the building of a fire prevention partnership between the fire Department and property owners. Firefighters that were previously performing the inspections continue to spend additional time on training and station duties. Walk-throughs of properties are being conducted by firefighters focusing the visit on firefighting aspects such as construction types, planning tactics, firefighting hazards, and other building characteristics.

Important benefits of fire inspections are to provide an opportunity to educate citizens on fire safety. People want to do the right thing; however they sometimes do not know what the right thing is. It is easy for the fire service to forget that the average citizen doesn't live in the firefighting world and they may not understand or think about the importance of clearance from a sprinkler head, egress paths, or not storing items under a stairwell. The goal of Merrill Fire Department's Inspector is to educate, not punish citizens. Once the reasoning behind the codes is understood, most of the time compliance is reached. Property and business owners want to make sure that their employees and customers are safe and that their investment is protected from fire risk.
