Executive Summary

Subject: Interfacility Ambulance Transfers originating from non-Lincoln County Hospitals

Background: Lincoln County started contracted ambulance service with the Merrill Fire Department in 1970. In a 1969 news article by Dewey Pfister on the creation of county ambulance service, it specifically states, "All ambulance conveyances to or from medical care or treatment facilities outside Lincoln County will be made by off-duty Merrill firemen, except in an extreme emergency when immediate transporting is required or when Merrill ambulances are in use at the time." When speaking with retirees, they recall taking ambulance transfers from facilities other than Good Samaritan. Retirees mentioned that it was not unusual to take ambulance transfers from Sacred Heart in Tomahawk.

For decades, our department actively conducted ambulance transfers. It was not unusual for our service to have 300 + transfers annually. Over the years, those transfers have dwindled down to only 23 in 2020. There are multiple reasons for the reduction, but until this point it was never because we did not want to take them.

Finances: Interfacility ambulance transfers generate revenue. This revenue offsets ambulance budgets which reduces or maintains county taxes. Typically the longer the transfer the more money is generated. On a transfer from Minocqua to Weston on December 7, 2020, we billed \$1,843.70. As verified by Helen Downs, Lincoln County Emergency Medical Services Biller, the county collected \$1,102.28 from the transfer. On a transfer from Minocqua to Marshfield on January 19, 2021, we billed \$2,281.00, but at the time of this publication we are unable to verify the collected amount.

City department heads have been tasked with finding additional revenue for the city. Even though ambulance transfers generate revenue for the county, it still helps city residents in their county taxes. Ambulance transfers originating outside of Lincoln County actually bring money back into our county. It is not often that new, or improved, revenue streams are made. Current local elected officials have varied interest and feedback on this additional revenue. With uncertainty from officials on whether or not they should support transfers, it is difficult to plan for the future. Additionally it will be frustrating for fire personnel if they hear later that we should have been more aggressive in interfacility ambulance transfers. The cost for emergency services is not cheap, but we have been willing to try and keep cost down by adding revenue that will offset our operational budgets.

Authority: Operations within a city department should be managed by the respective department head. Every department has their respective oversight committee, but it is not the job of the oversight committee to micromanage a department. Per city ordinance, the fire chief reports monthly to the Health & Safety Committee. At their regular January 2021 meeting, the Personnel & Finance Committee

put ambulance transfers on their agenda with NO prior communication with the fire chief. If the authority of that committee was not questioned, I believe that the committee would have attempted to micromanage the fire department by limiting these transfers and the authority of the fire chief to run the operations of the department. At the regular January 2021 meeting of the Health & Safety Committee, which was held the night before Personnel & Finance, they supported these ambulance transfers and the authority of the fire chief to safely, efficiently, and effectively run the operations of the fire department.

As a county owned ambulance service, the Merrill Fire Chief also reports monthly to the Lincoln County EMS Committee. The primary focus of the county committee is to oversee the ambulance budget and finances related to ambulance billing. In previous years, the Merrill City Council has influenced the county EMS Committee to add ambulance transfer restrictions like a 75 mile maximum radius to conduct transfers. A decision that was made by elected officials who were more concerned about the overtime of our personnel than the revenue generated. That policy decision cost Lincoln County significantly in lost revenue, revenue that we cannot make up. Fortunately in 2018, the county EMS Committee reversed that decision which once again allowed for additional revenue to be made. When current EMS Committee Chair was contacted last month by an alderperson, he was asked to once again meddle in the operations of the fire department. To his credit, he refused to partake in this attempt to micromanage our department. In contrast, Chairman Loka supported the decisions of the fire chief to run his/her department as they see fit and the ambulance contract between Lincoln County and the City of Merrill which does not allow for the EMS Committee to dictate policy to the Merrill Fire Department. This includes decisions as simple as the color of an ambulance.

Internal Discussions: As chief, it is important to seek the input of all personnel when faced with larger organizational decisions. Ultimately the decision lies with the chief, but the feedback from staff can be invaluable to help guide organizational decisions especially that could have a significant impact on the future of the organization. In the case of transfers originating outside of our county, a confidential survey was offered to all members of the department. 21 of 23 full time personnel offered their input and results were split 50/50 which meant that even within our ranks, we could not determine a clear consensus on this issue.

Prior to the survey, we had discussion on that topic with each crew. Discussions were about staffing, safety, ambulance maintenance, cost of the ambulance service, and generating revenue. Some staff were reluctant to take more ambulance transfers especially those who have worked for other ambulance services prior to us. Overall the discussions were positive and beneficial, but there was no definitive consensus on the issue after crew discussions.

It is also important to note that Merrill Firefighters IAFF Local 847 was unsure if they supported these transfers. It was pointed out that these "non-emergent" transfers might be in violation of their new

duty day language if personnel were not granted down time per Article 6 of the 2020 – 2021 CBA. The union argued that both of the transfers listed earlier in this document followed the contract, so no grievance was filed. I disagreed that these transfers were subject to the duty day language and Battalion Chiefs exercised good decision making and managing their personnel by granting down time as needed for the transfers. In both transfers, paramedics that were on-duty did not receive hour for hour down time.

Recommendations: After all of the discussion on these transfers at various levels and committees as well as the results of our survey, we will not pursue ambulance transfers originating outside of Lincoln County. There are valid reasons for pursuing this funding opportunity, but there are also legitimate operational considerations to note. We will continue to keep our options open for future transfers, but I believe that it is unlikely that we will have this opportunity again in the near future. After consulting with Merrill City Attorney Tom Hayden, we will revise SOG Response (F)-02: Ambulance Transfers to allow us the flexibility to still take non-emergent, interfacility ambulance transfers originating outside of Lincoln County upon specific patient requests.

The purpose of this executive summary is to capture the facts surrounding this topic and timestamp this decision in the history of our organization. Future generations of Merrill firefighter/paramedics will be able to reference this summary and they can judge the wisdom of our decision.

Deputy Health Officer Ashbeck then stated that he would contact Mr. Bergman and invite him to a future meeting.

Fire Chief Klug inquired as to whether parochial schools were included in the plan.

Motion (Blake/Weix) to approve the Safe Routes to School plan, as presented, and refer this recommendation to the Common Council. This recommendation to approve would be considered by the Common Council in the form of a resolution.

2. Consider recommendation(s) to Common Council on opening of City facilities

Mayor Woellner expressed surprise that this item was placed on the agenda. He reviewed his current plan on potential reopening of facilities. He predicts that Lincoln County is close to being classified in the HIGH COVID-19 level rather than VERY HIGH.

Alderman Sabatke shared his opinion that the closing of facilities is not helping to fight the COVID-19 pandemic. He added that the continued closure of the Enrichment Center is costing the City money.

Note: At this point, Alderman Russell asked Alderman Hass to temporarily run the meeting. Later in the meeting, Alderman Russell reassumed chairmanship.

Mayor Woellner stated that the goals on his current policy on closures are to set an example and protect the citizens. Alderman Hass agreed with Mayor Woellner.

Alderman Blake and Alderman Weix would like to see reopening plans in place before actually reopening takes place.

It was noted that the Mayor has the ultimate authority on this matter. It was agreed that more information should be available next week, and that the new information can be analyzed before any decisions are made.

No action was taken at this time.

3. Discuss progress of transforming Health and Safety Committee into Public Safety/Board of Public Health

Alderman Blake explained that the committee members were assigned a task related to this agenda item. His task was to determine whether Wisconsin State Statutes allow a City to create its own health department. He then read a portion of Wisconsin State Statutes Chapter 251. He concluded by stating that it appears that state statutes do not allow a City to create its own Health Department.

Alderman Weix reported that he conducted research related to the possibility of including more medical professionals on the Health and Safety Committee. He tried to contact Dr. Gill to determine whether Dr. Gill wants to remain a committee member, but Dr. Gill was out of town. He will also contact other area medical professionals and ask them whether they would be interested in serving on the committee.

Alderman Russell stated that these issues need be researched further.

Mayor Woeller remarked that the Health and Safety Committee already has the power to act as a Board of Health.

No action was taken.

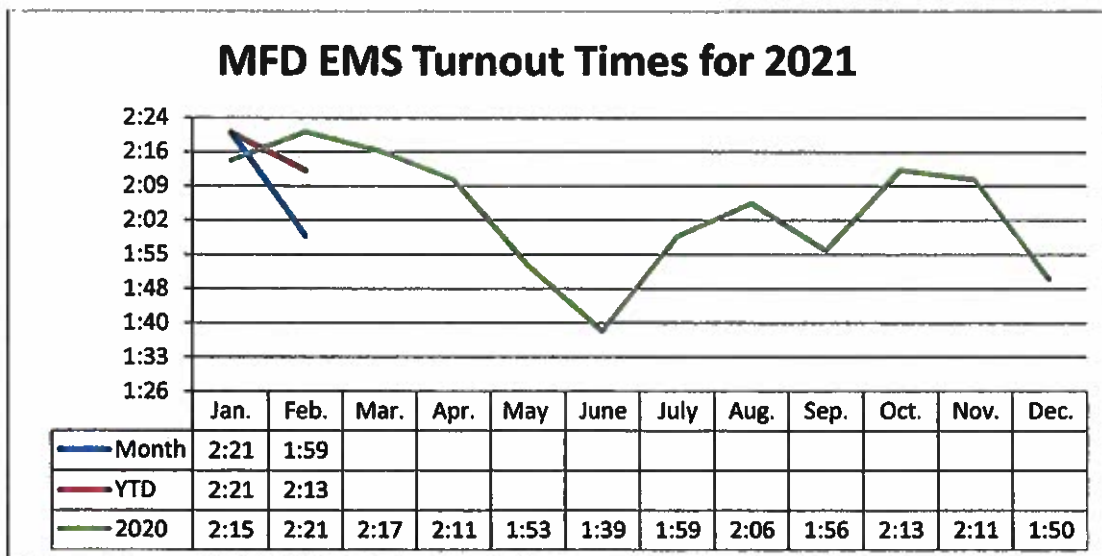
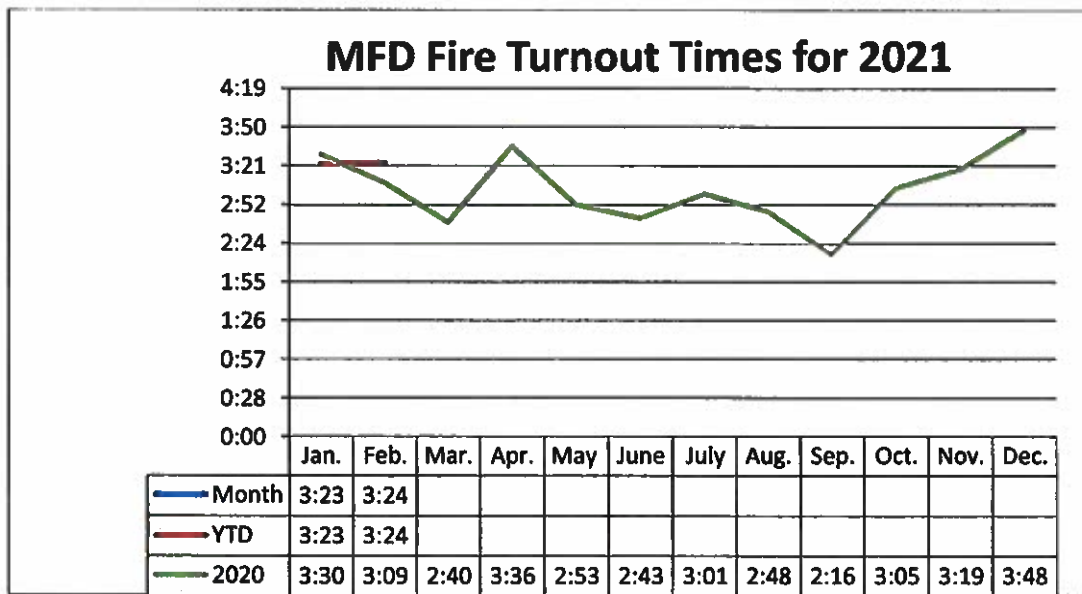
