Training is an essential component of the fire service. We could break training into two sub-categories: new and existing, or ongoing. As an all hazards fire department, we must train for the various services that we provide. They include fire suppression, wildland fire suppression, vehicle extrication, water & ice rescue, off-road rescue, high & low angle rescue, hazardous materials, and confined space rescue. It can be a daunting task to try and maintain proficiency in each of those disciplines. Ideally an annual training schedule is created with intentions of following it. Below are some of the benefits of an efficient and effective ongoing training.

- Maintain existing class 2 ISO rating (2nd highest possible rating) which training is important component of the rating.
- Our personnel want and need well organized hands on training. Watching videos and verbalizing how we would handle a situation is not enough.
- Organized, hands on training promotes recruitment & retention of members.
- Consistency in training is important to overall operations of the department. Consistent training would result in similar benefits like when we made changes to fire inspection program by using only one inspector.

Under the sub-category of new training, it could be described as two-fold. First, new training would incorporate new challenges and hazards like electric vehicles and lithium ion batteries. New hazards are constantly changing and being introduced. Who knows what else we will be exposed to and have to respond to in the future. It will be essential that we stay up with the times and on top of those new hazards because the health and safety of our firefighters and the citizens we serve depends on it. Recently we were delayed by several months getting new equipment into service because we lacked the time to coordinate training for all personnel on the new equipment before we could put it into service.


The other portion of “new training” is training our new members. For the past two decades, the Merrill Fire Department has been fortunate to hire paramedics and candidates who typically had some experience in the emergency response field. As we found out in our last hiring process, this is no longer the case. Like other fire departments in our region, state, and nation, we must accept the fact that there is a shortage of experienced and trained responders. This means we will need to invest in the success of our future candidates. The reality is we have hired and will likely continue to hire new employees who only have the most basic firefighting training. We will need to protect our investment when we launch these candidates through additional firefighting and rescue training. We can accomplish this through a

structured and formal fire recruit academy at the beginning of their employment. Here are some of the benefits of a new fire recruit training academy.

- Promote safety by training new employees properly before they are part of minimum staffing.
- Won't jeopardize existing staff by putting recruits into service before they are ready.
- Standardized recruit training of new employees will promote consistency on all crews.
- New workforce gets trained the way we operate versus coming from a different department.
- We have opportunity to introduce new employees to a profession that they love.

Finally there are additional benefits of adding a training division chief that are compelling as well. With this position, we create a position for current staff to possibly promote to. Staff has expressed concerns about the limited promotional opportunities that we have at our department. They have also noted that it could be a reason that they decide to leave in the future. We also have the added benefit of having another person to backfill the station when needed for callbacks. Another body would be helpful as we consistently have the need to use off duty staff when we are busy. Most importantly, the training division chief would free up time for battalion chiefs to focus on their main function which is supervising their crew. The more time battalion chiefs can spend with their crew versus being stuck in their office working on administrative duties helps promote camaraderie within. Plus it puts typically our most experienced member as a resource out on the apparatus floor with new employees yearning to learn more about their job.

Position

Purpose:

The purpose of this position is to lead, manage, and administer all aspects of the fire service and rescue training including entry-level training and education, continuing education and standard compliance for incumbent members, specialized response training for appropriate members, and the professional development of those members aspiring to or already promoted to a successive rank. The Division Chief is the liaison to local schools and colleges, other area emergency responders, and the community. Additionally the purpose of this position is to

Principal Duties and Responsibilities:

1. Maintain the professional standards for all fire department personnel. This includes reviewing the applicable standards, regulations and requirements and identifying the need for compliance and workplace development.
2. In coordination with the Battalion Chief plan and conduct regularly scheduled company and multi-company drills/training exercises in fire service and rescue disciplines.
3. Develop and maintain job performance requirements for individual and company-level knowledge and skills.
4. Develop lesson plans, lesson outlines, and training in accordance with set standard operating procedures and policies.
5. Responsible for properly tracking employee fire service and rescue training. Maintain electronic training files for all members and all training programs. Upon request, develop and produce monthly, quarterly, and annual reports of training performance.
6. Maintain thorough knowledge of the agency's apparatus and the tools and equipment carried on them.
7. Identify and apply for grant opportunities to enhance the training program.
8. Continually evaluate best practices to refine, revise, enhance, improve, and update training programs and related content.
9. Ensure compliance with state and federal regulations, national standards, and best practices such as (but not limited to) OSHA, ISO, NFPA, DSPS, and the City's Insurance carrier.
10. Develop and manage task books for Probationary Firefighter/EMTs and acting Battalion Chiefs.
11. Upon request, attend MABAS meetings.
12. Maintain memberships in professional associations. Attend conferences and seminars which support the training officer activities.
13. Oversees and/or records all completed training.
15. Assists in researching and developing policies, protocols, and procedures, to include analyzing, drafting, coordinating preparation and implementation.

16. Supervises and assists the cleaning and maintenance of equipment and station as necessary.
17. Staffs an ambulance at the Paramedic level as needed in staff shortages.
19. Integrates health and safety plans, policies, and procedures into daily work activities; ability to conduct initial accident and incident investigations.
20. Participates on appropriate committees as a representative for the Merrill Fire Department to ensure the Departments interests are represented or to advance the Department.
21. Assists with vehicle and equipment procurement within budgetary guidelines.
22. Monitors and evaluates section expenditures, which includes recommendation of budget items; evaluating past fiscal spending; anticipating future spending; and performing other budget related activities.
23. Assists the Fire Inspector with fire inspections, code enforcement, and other inspection division responsibilities as needed.
24. Researches and identifies grant opportunities in EMS/Fire and be able to persuasively communicate the Merrill Fire Department's mission in developing, writing, and submitting grant proposals to third-party entities.
25. Assists in preparing plans that outline operating procedures to be used in response to disasters/emergencies.
26. May act in place of and assume duties of the fire chief in their absence.

Additional Duties and Responsibilities:

- Other duties as may be necessary to fulfill the responsibilities of this position.
- Perform duties of a Battalion Chief as needed.

Work Relationships and Scope:

Reports to: Fire Chief

Supervises: The whole department through training and EMS requirements as listed above.

Work Relationships: Works very closely with Merrill Fire/EMS department employees, City Employees, other fire departments and EMR groups, ER hospital staff, and the public.

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities, Qualifications Required:

Education, Experience, and Qualifications:

This position requires a minimum of five years of full-time firefighting and EMS experience supplemented by an associate's degree in fire science, EMS, public administration, or other related field. The following licenses and certifications are required:

- State of Wisconsin or nationally accredited Fire Officer I.
- State of Wisconsin licensed or Nationally Registered EMT - Paramedic.
- Emergency Services Instructor I.
- State of Wisconsin Fire Inspector I
- National Incident Management System (NIMS) certifications in ICS-700, 100, 200, 300, 400.
- Incident Safety Officer.
- Basic Life Support (BLS), Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS), and Pediatric Life Support (PALS) certifications.

- Candidates must also possess a valid driver's license and acceptable driving record.

The following licenses and certifications are required within 2 years:

- Emergency Services Instructor II.
- State of Wisconsin or nationally accredited Fire Officer II.

The following are desired educational and experience qualifications:

- Substantial experience as a trainer or teacher within EMS and/or fire service.
- Supervisory experience within leadership positions.
- A bachelor's degree in fire science, EMS, public administration or other related field.

Skills/Abilities:

- Ability to communicate effectively, orally and in writing.
- Knowledge of methods and procedures of managing Emergency Medical Services
- Knowledge of rules and regulations governing the operations of ambulance services.
- Knowledge of the principles of personnel management including recruiting, retention, training, and discipline
- Knowledge of effective methods of supervision and ability to manage staff effectively.
- Knowledge of the National Incident Management System
- Knowledge of basic and Advanced Life Support practices and procedures, and HIPAA regulations and procedures
- Proficient knowledge of Microsoft Office or other related products and tools
- Ability to work under extremely stressful situations.
- Ability to analyze and categorize data and information using established criteria, in order to determine consequences and to identify and select alternatives.
- Ability to exercise the judgment, decisiveness and creativity required in situations involving the evaluation of information against sensory and/or judgmental criteria.
- Ability to advise and provide interpretation regarding the application of policies, procedures and standards to specific situations.
- Ability to utilize a variety of advisory and design data and information such as training reports, training materials, personnel records, equipment test records, maintenance schedules, EMS licenses, personnel evaluations, training forms, State statutes, ordinances, computer software manuals, labor contract, policy manuals, safety standards and manuals and educational curricula.
- Ability to operate equipment and machinery, with some requiring complex and rapid adjustments, such as fire suppression equipment and related tools and computer keyboard.
- Ability to exert physical effort in moderate to heavy work, typically involving some combination of climbing and balancing, stooping, kneeling, crouching, crawling, lifting, carrying, pushing, and pulling.
- Ability to evaluate, plan and execute emergency and non-emergency operations.

Physical and Working Conditions:

Job Conditions/Work Location:

Work is performed in a fire station, fire scenes, accident scenes, homes and businesses. Work hours are normally during assigned regular shifts and may be subject to call and or revisions depending on the City's needs. May include nights, weekends, and holidays. May be required to travel out of town for education and professional development.

Physical Requirements:

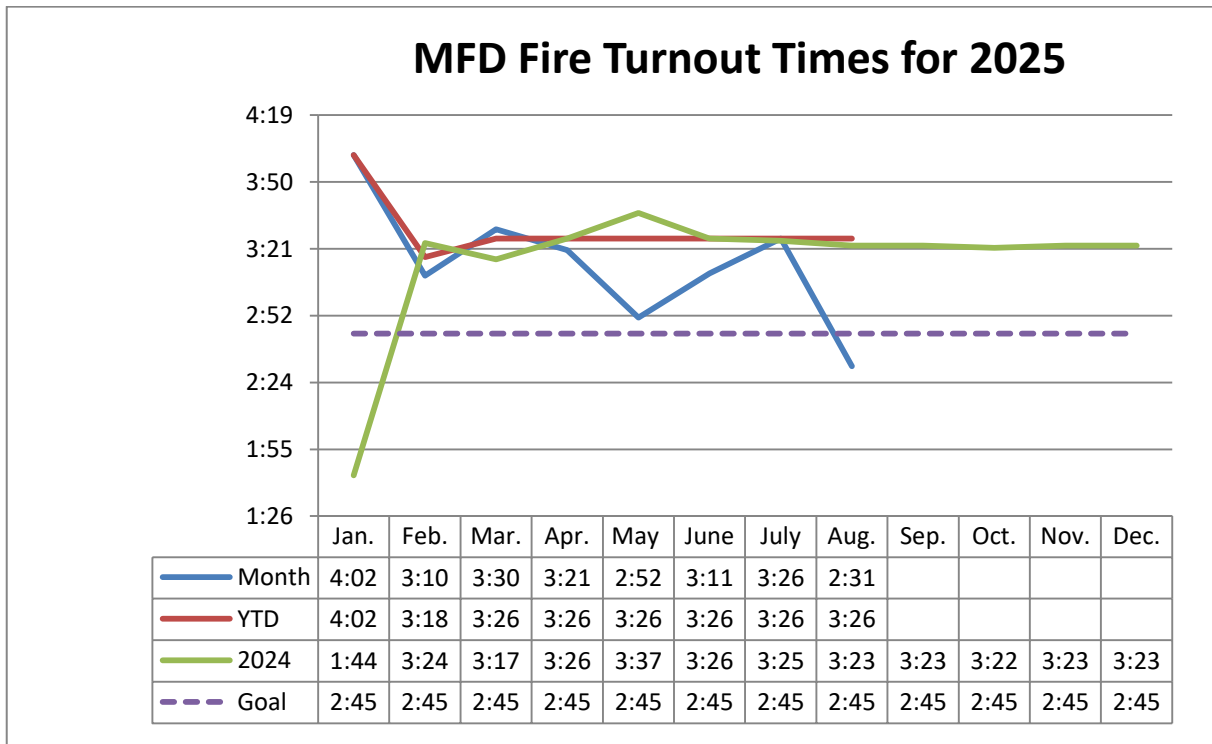
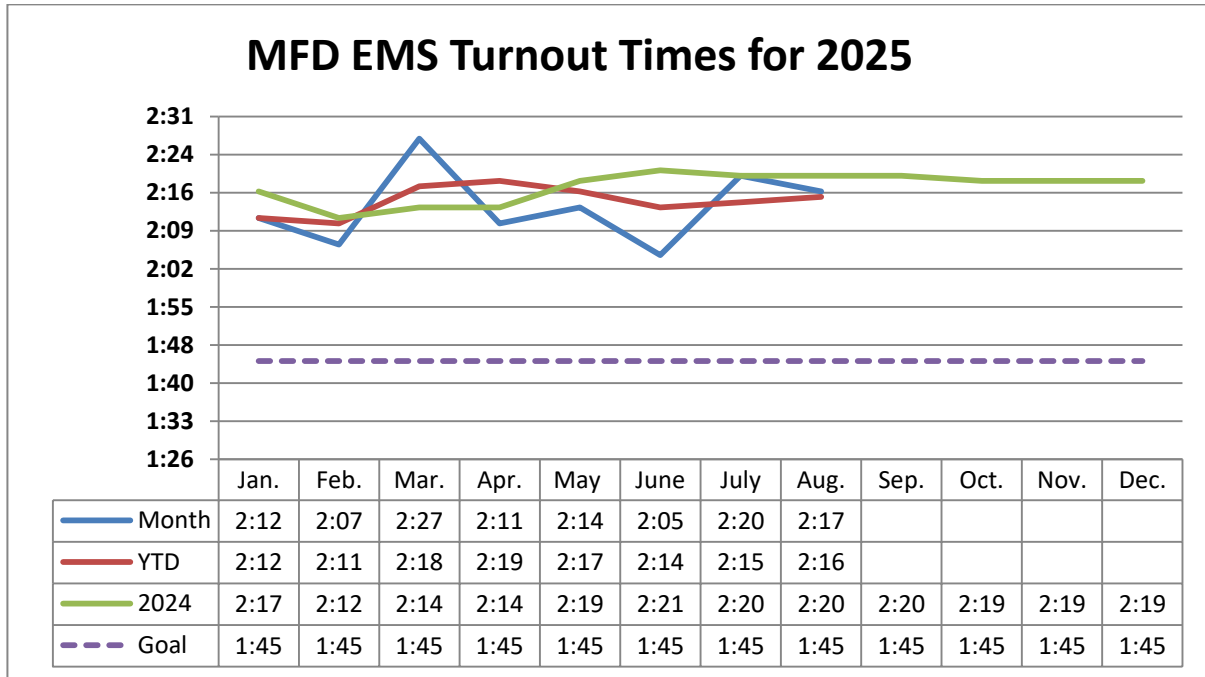

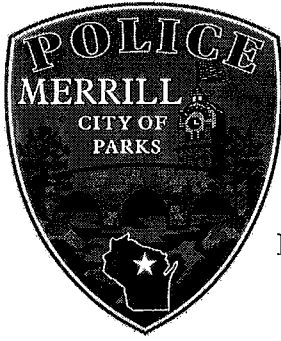
