Merrill Police Department ANNUAL REPORT



Mayor, members of the Police & Fire Commission,
and members of the Common Council,

The 2025 operational period for the Merrill Police Department was nothing new or unexpected in the grand scheme of things. 2025 contained many of the same challenges we have faced in recent years, including retirements and unexpected vacancies that brought some additional stressors. As you have come to expect though, everyone rose to the occasion admirably and we persevered through those challenges and into the next.

Staffing

Staffing has been a consistent challenge in recent times, usually due to the difficulty or extended processes in hiring. In 2025, staffing was complicated or influenced by 3 distinct factors:

- Vacancies
- Hiring
- Simultaneous Field Training

As stated in previous reports, staffing is the key to “normal” operations at the Police Department. Without full staffing, so many other key activities naturally become limited to ensure we have minimal staffing in place to serve the city. Activities such as specialized training, focused enforcement, the ability to capture time-off for employees, etc. are all diminished by less staffing.

Vacancies

We experienced five sworn officer vacancies in 2025, two due to resignations, two due to retirements and one due to being a newly created position (SRO #2). Resignations use to be a rare event and exclusive to officers choosing another agency to work for. However we are observing mostly other circumstances whereby officers are simply leaving the profession. These facts are not unique to this profession or the Merrill PD and are a distinct component of a more mobile workforce. We have certainly taken advantage of these circumstances when recruiting and it’s only expected that the same will happen within our circle. That being said, these particular vacancies tend to be less predictable than retirements and usually don’t allow us to get a “head start” on a candidate search.

In January of 2025, SRO Jamie Jaeger, Captain Bacher, and Administrative Assistant Christine Brahos officially retired. In February of 2025 Officer Christina Doering resigned to take employment in the private sector, leaving an additional vacancy in patrol. In December of 2025 Detective Lt. Tyler Tesch resigned due to unexpected conduct leaving a vacancy in the detective division. Additionally, the City of Merrill and Merrill Area Public Schools came to a new agreement on SRO funding and allocation. The end result was the creation of a new SRO position, an additional sworn officer position. As the hiring process was underway for the original vacancies, the

process was simply extended for the remaining positions until we could step our way to the end result.

At the very end of 2025, as we headed into 2026, we are aware that we have two known vacancies to fill yet again.

Hiring and selection

The hiring process(s) began almost immediately with the knowledge of retirements. Again, rather than a traditional model of only advertised recruitment, we approached the process more proactively. While we will always advertise our open positions in the traditional sense, we now use more direct methods of recruitment. We reach out to additional candidates who we become aware of via professional acquaintances, the local recruit academies, etc. As these applicants come forward they are placed through the standard battery of testing and interviews with our staff. These hiring processes (still ongoing) have been unique due to the number of failed background checks we have encountered in recent years. I cannot recall a time when we experienced the same results but maybe our methods are just getting more refined and proven too.

Position #1: We were able to find Emily Treglowne in early 2025. Emily was enrolled in the Mid-State Technical College recruit academy at the time of her application, but still participated in our process, as time permitted, and she did very well obviously. Emily started with the Merrill PD in June of 2025. Emily has been a great addition to the department and the community. She has done well in her first year of service and does an excellent job keeping her coworkers cohesive.

Position #2: In early 2025 we revisited some other candidates that we have become aware of in previous hiring processes. This is how we had come to know Ben Smith. Ben graduated from the same Recruit Academy as Alex Shimanski in late 2023. I had made contact with Ben not long after and stayed in contact with him for just such a future occasion. On this occasion, Ben was looking for more full-time Law Enforcement employment and looking to make more concrete plans for his future. His recruitment was very smooth and he started with us on the same day as Officer Treglowne, June of 2025. Ben came to us with some part-time Law Enforcement experience in Edgar WI. He also had years of experience having worked with a Fire Department in the Wausau area. That experience has shown in his work here and he has made a great addition to the department.

Position #3: A little bit later in 2025 we identified Boe Nienow who was currently enrolled in the NTC Recruit Academy. Boe was able to participate in our process and we were excited to bring him on board as soon as practical. Boe started after Officers Treglowne and Smith, which actually assisted with us layering training a bit. Boe is from the rural Merrill area and his energy level has been a welcomed addition.

Position #4: This position was the last sworn position we were attempting to fill in 2025 and its purpose was to backfill patrol for the selection of the newly created SRO #2. Through the same hiring cycle we eventually had evaluated Kailey Schmoll who had just finished her Associates Degree program in Criminal Justice at NTC.

Kailey was prepared to attend the NTC Fall Recruit Academy but was also looking to be potentially sponsored by a Law Enforcement Agency. This arrangement worked well for us as we were already at or near capacity for field training. Kailey also had a very strong academic record and we had high confidence in her ability to successfully complete the recruit academy. So, Kailey was hired as an LTE Officer while she attended the academy and ultimately graduated in December 2025. This is the first Officer Merrill PD has sponsored in the recruit academy since pre-2000. Currently, Officer Schmoll is completing field training.

Position #5: This was a non-sworn position that was vacated by the retirement of Christine Brahos. We initially didn't know which direction the city wanted to move as there had been informal talk for quite a while about eliminating a clerical position. The real question seems to be more centered around whether we want to maintain a front desk that operates during normal business hours. This lone fact is what dictates staffing levels in this division. After some time monitoring how the front office functioned with two employees, there was a group decision to hire a part time clerical position to help cover the morning rush of report activity. That hiring process brought us Heather Ohlmann, a very capable individual. Heather has taken to the role incredibly well and with some sense of ease. There was a lot of competition for this position.

Additionally, the senior Administrative Assistant/Property and Evidence Manager would be reclassified to a lead role whereby they would have more management and control of the day to day caseload the front office processes. So far, this arrangement has functioned but it is not perfect as far as keeping the front office open during business hours. Future needs may require a change to this level of staffing and I will expand on this more below.

Selections: The three retirements and the additional SRO position yielded opportunity for promotion and selection within the Police Department for 2025. As staffing was limited we had to go without an SRO in the Spring semester of early 2025. That being said we had a hiring plan in place which we knew would allow us to fill both SRO positions starting in the Fall. The first selection was Detective Nicole Cimino. Nicole was looking for a change from normal Detective duties she had been performing over the last decade. Her selection actually occurred before the end of the 2024-25 school year which allowed us to make some introductions prior to school dismissal. Closer to the start of the 2025-26 school year we were able to select the second SRO. There was some competition for the position but ultimately Officer John Sass was selected. John and Nicole have both taken extreme ownership of their new roles and have integrated well with school staff at their respective campus locations. As this is their first year as dedicated SRO's (not a shared SRO), I expect there will be some more time spent between school administration and our SRO's getting to know their roles and areas of separation. This is a process.

Promotions and selections in 2025 were an expected cascade effect. As Captain Bacher had retired we needed to select a Police Captain who has both administrative and operation responsibilities. Don Seubert was clearly the best and most credible choice for that position and he was promoted in March 2025. As Captain Seubert vacated the Detective Lt. role we had limited interest amongst current Lt's to move to that position. Lt. Tesch had shown promise and ability in this area and we also thought it would be a great development opportunity for him for the future. As such, he was asked to take on this role and he accepted that challenge in March of 2025. As Lt. Tesch moved out of Patrol this presented an open Patrol Lt. position for one of our four shifts. Dane Mathwich has had interest in this position for quite some time. Dane is able to recognize and convey the principles of command and leadership and as such was selected to be the next Patrol Lt. He also was officially promoted in March 2025.

Field Training

We had a fair amount of field training activity in 2025. Unlike previous years, we had simultaneous field training taking place. In total, we field trained three new officers at very close to the same timeline. This is not an easy task and it involves all shifts of patrol. Consistent with the previous year annual report, it was time to start looking towards training others to become field training officers if we want to keep our hiring and training process meaningful and moving forward. In 2025 we formally trained Officers Lor and Asmundsen to become a Field Training Officers. Additionally we had Officers Shimanski and Zibton become acquainted with the FTO process from the perspective of the training officer. All were given stages of Field Training to complete with newly hired officers. Again, we intend to add more as time and experience progresses but for now we are supplementing FTO's with some of our Lieutenants who were once FTO's. This is also a welcome change of pace. It gives the Lieutenants a change of duties and it also establishes a great training and supervision relationship early in an officer's career. That being said, we can't have every Lt. engaged in this as they have a separate caseload to monitor.

Department Training

Department-wide training and specialty training occurred in 2025, as time and staffing allowed. In 2025 we were able to accomplish the basic in-service requirements of 24 hours per officer and more. We have always been able to reach this benchmark without fail. The more specialized areas of training are naturally limited and will only be meaningful investments given to those who have an interest and who have earned the opportunity. We can't simply "throw" training at our employees, in a random sense, and expect it to lift them. In 2025 the Department logged a total of over 900 training hours. This did not include field training hours, recruit academy hours, or K9 training hours. We did accomplish some specialty training for some officers as well. Those are itemized below:

- NORDEG basic (Officer Asmundsen. Officer Lor rescheduled to 2026)
- Field Training Officer (Asmundsen/Lor)
- Instructor Development (Sass)
- Firearms Instructor (Sass)
- Tactical Emergency Casualty Care Instructor (Caylor)
- Tactical Response (Pufall)
- Armorer (Glock school cancelled twice-rescheduled into 2026-Sass/Shimanski)

In 2026 we will seek to improve our investment in training all employees and we are already off to a great start. As stated in the previous annual report:

“As we prepare for the future and new leaders to emerge, we need to focus on developing employees in key areas of training, specialties, leadership and supervision. Given the outlook of foreseeable retirements, we need to make significant investments in these opportunities to help transition to our next generation of qualified employees. It is apparent that the experience gap respective to new supervisors and new officers will be an obstacle we will have to contend with in the near future. With this in mind, the investments made over the next five years will be crucial.”

Additions and Innovations

In late 2024 the Merrill PD participated in a Lincoln County specific grant to obtain multiband portable radios for the whole of Lincoln County public safety agencies. The radios acquired are capable of communication on a number of frequency bands and encryption levels making them ideal for response to larger disasters and events. In fact, the technology is so far beyond what we are accustomed to, it will take us a while to be able to fully take advantage of their capabilities. These radios were acquired in late 2024 and were deployed or issued in 2025. These radios are influencing the direction and capability of our mobile radios installed in every squad car. As we replace squads now, we will try to replace the mobile radios with the comparable mobile unit. One new squad replaced in 2025 received a new mobile multiband radio. The new squad budgeted for 2026 is planned to have the same.

In 2025 we also began a subscription to DataPilot, a forensic evidence tool for mobile devices. Our previous product subscription became unsustainable in the cooperative partnership program with other Lincoln County agencies after they decided to discontinue. Ultimately we had to find another solution that wasn't cost prohibitive, that we could maintain for ourselves. DataPilot has been used on multiple investigations already. It is also a tool we can train the entire department on using for analysis of data, unlike other subscriptions.

In 2025 we also acquired an E-Bike donation from a local charitable organization. Lt. Caylor, also a member of the Lion's Club, applied for an E-Bike to be used for special patrol operations. The request was granted and we took delivery of the bike in 2025. The E-bike can be deployed as staffing allows. The only requirement in place is that the operating officer wears a helmet and has knowledge of how to properly operate the equipment.

Structure/Organization/Scheduling

Our authorized staffing levels and structure in 2025 did change from the previous year due to the addition of the SRO #2 and other changes. We also reduced the Detective Bureau back to two detectives, returning the 3rd position to patrol while we worked to re-gain our patrol staffing levels. Additionally, we made a slight change in non-sworn staffing levels as described earlier. Other than that, we maintained our relatively traditional organizational structure. It was a long road to get back to it but I firmly believe the traditional organizational structure we had pre-2017 is the best model we can support as a city. The needs of our City may require additional changes, movement, and hard decisions going forward. However, a more crucial part of that conversation is the services and level of service we, as a city, choose to prioritize. Considering the current call volume and complexity of police work required in modern times, I do not believe we can sacrifice any further law enforcement positions to budget shortfalls moving forward.

One improvement that we looked at making as we planned 2026 is to allow the K9 officer to be scheduled to their own "special" shift. That special shift could then supplement all other patrol shifts without requiring the K9 to be routinely counted on for normal shift strength and staffing. The unique requirements of the K9 position require more frequent monthly training away and slightly shorter working shifts. **This ultimately leads to a consistent staffing loss on a normal patrol shift.** Essentially, separating the K9 from normal patrol staffing while allowing them to "float" amongst all shifts would give us the best return on investment and a more complete use of this position. This issue has been something we have struggled with since day 1 of having a K9.

Outlook

Determining the future needs of the department involves using a little bit of experience and a little bit of best guess-work. With that said, almost any need will depend upon staffing. Whether it is to maintain our authorized levels or potentially increase them in the future, our candidate pool is limited and the world is changing when considering how mobile employees can be. At the time of this report, this is and has been our biggest struggle, and has been largely since the COVID era. One strategy

we have not considered is to authorize a provisional/LTE officer position (or more as desired) which exceeds our authorized staffing levels. This would allow us to buffer the shortage in our favor for a period of time, get the next officer trained, etc. Of course this is still costly and would have to be monitored closely so as not to exceed budgeted amounts for employee wages and benefits.

I foresee caseloads in the Detective Bureau eventually forcing us to consider a 3rd Detective again in the future. As of this time, we have been fortunate to have “hungry” patrol officers willing to take on more than we would normally assign them and help the Detective Bureau shoulder this load. It is great experience for them too. Additionally, at least one SRO will be assigned to the Detective Bureau for the summer months to supplement. These are not permanent solutions to a predictable caseload level. Eventually, we will again have to make a decision on whether to pull that staffing from another part of the department or increase this number with a new position.

I also foresee an administrative or clerical task becoming more burdensome than it already is. Open record requests are increasing and becoming more common to involve digital media, especially body worn camera footage. Digital media that has to be reviewed in its entirety to see if it’s able to be released. This multiplies the time it takes to properly respond to a lawful record request. That doesn’t include the time it takes to commonly redact the typed records we have to release with them. An appropriate strategy for now is to cross train multiple employees for fulfilling open records requests and share the load. In the future, I would consider looking at the part-time clerical position and potentially returning it to full-time. In terms of cost, this is the most affordable solution that exists when considering staffing adjustments.

Data and Statistics

The following pages explore common statistical areas of noteworthy importance. While these statistics are the best we can produce and report, there are limitations in the precision and accuracy of those numbers. As we learn this records system better and become more familiar with reporting nuances, these numbers will get more precise and accurate over time. Further, as the concept of time and time investment is not captured in these reports, they do not convey our complete activity accurately. That being said, I believe these are best viewed as a “glimpse” of our activity.

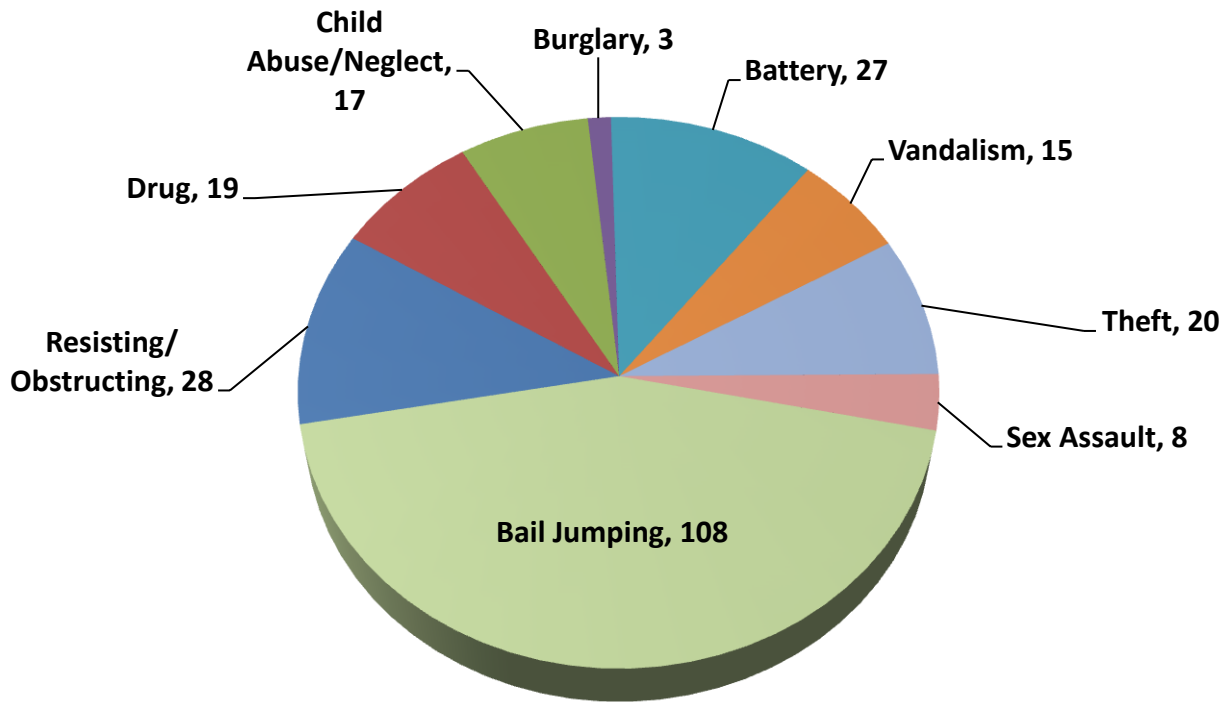

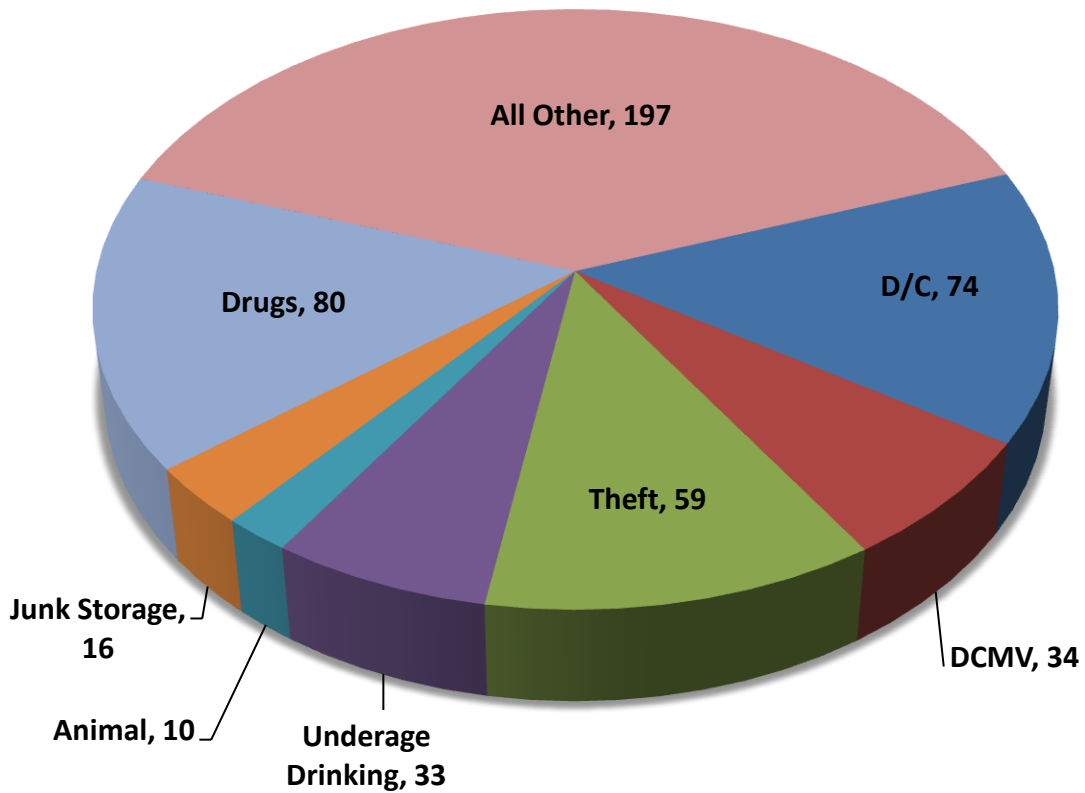

2025 Adult Criminal Arrests (for specific offenses)



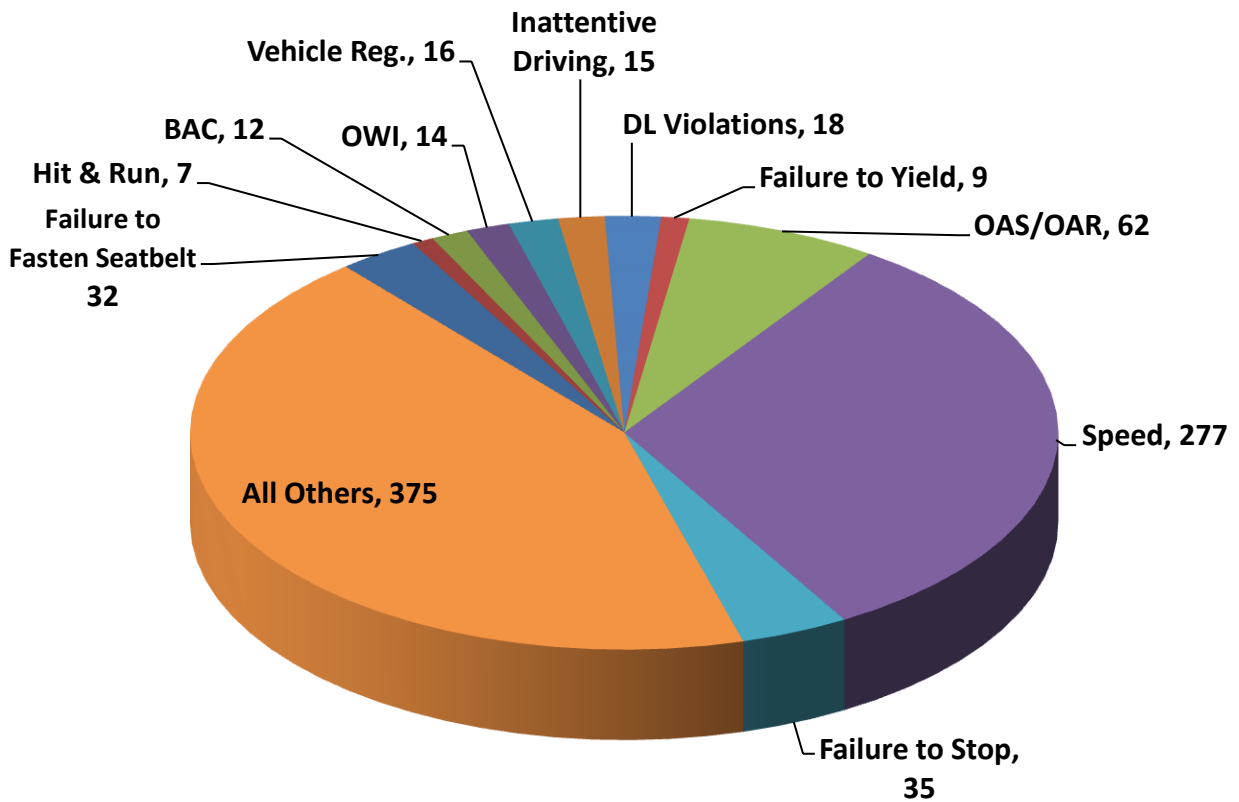

2025 Ordinance Citations Issued



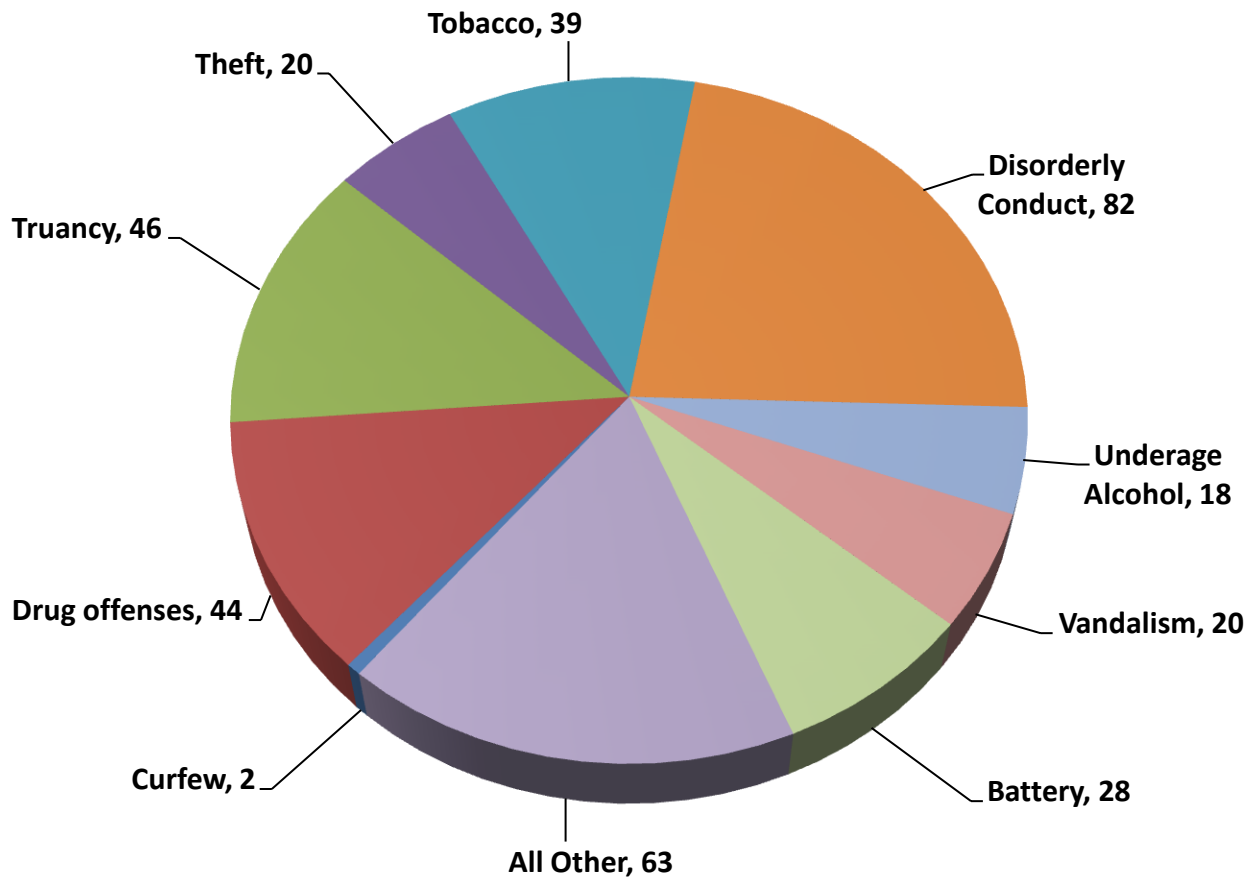
The total amount of ordinance citations for 2025 was 503 which include all ages compared to 386 in 2024.

The total amount of traffic citations issued in 2025 was 866 which include adults and juveniles.

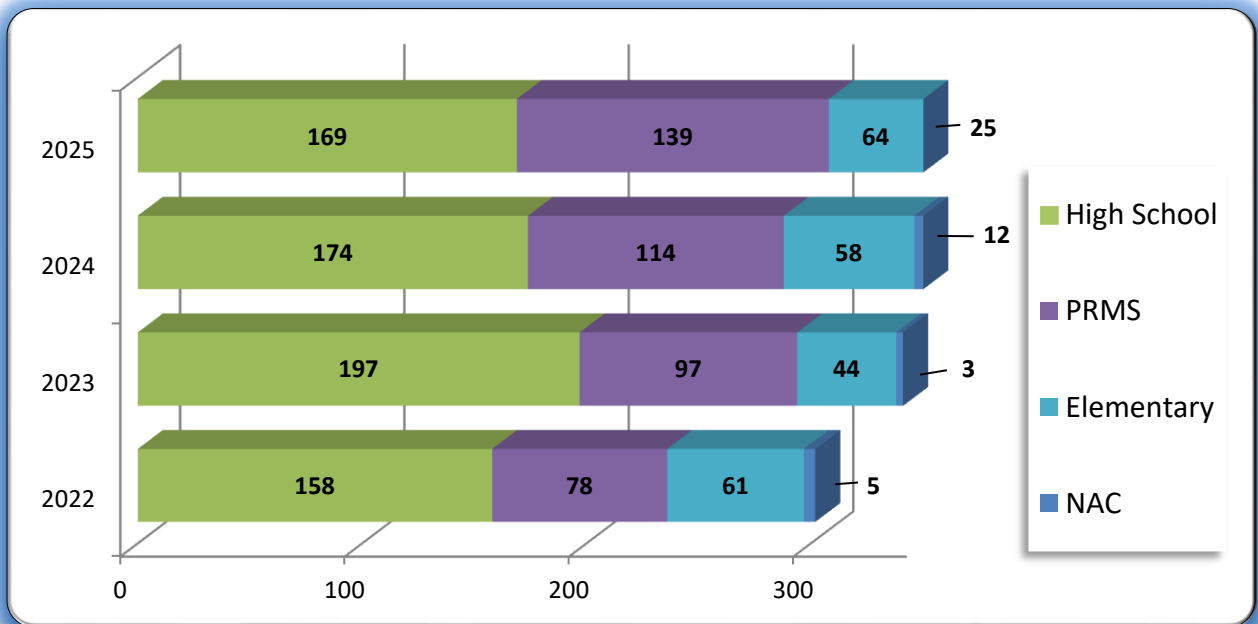
2025 Juvenile Arrest Statistics for specific offenses (17 years of age and under)

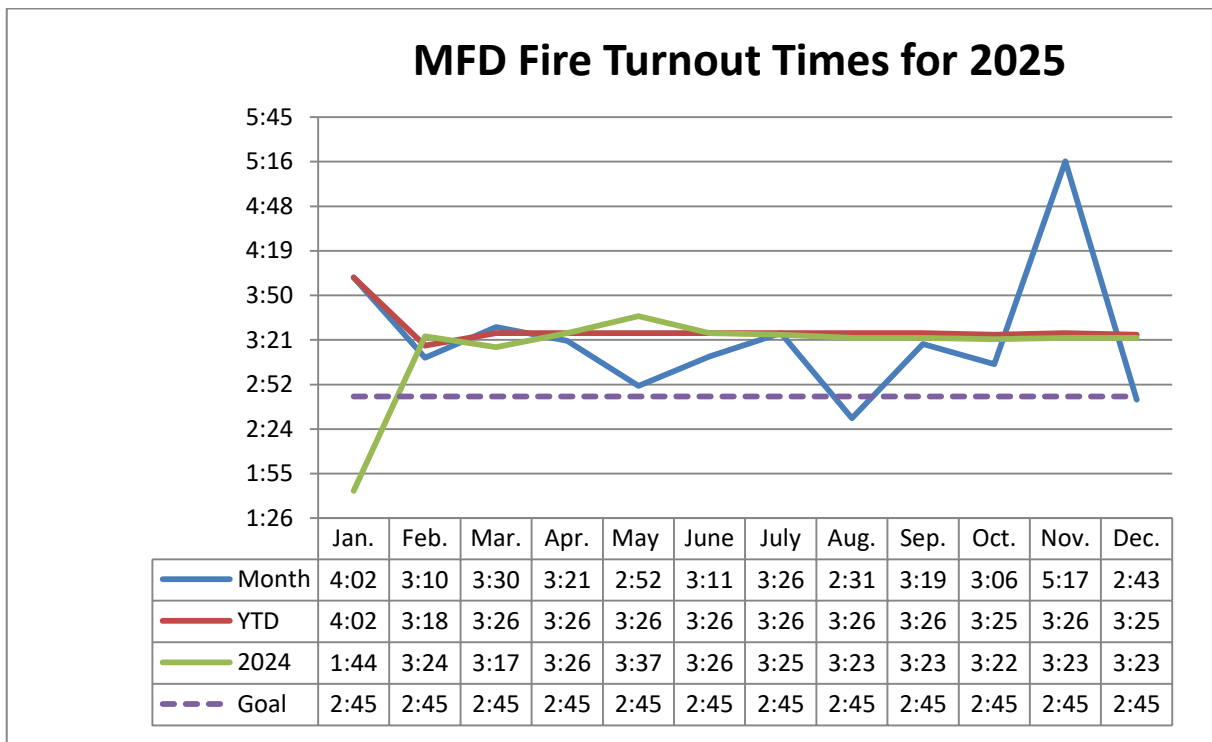
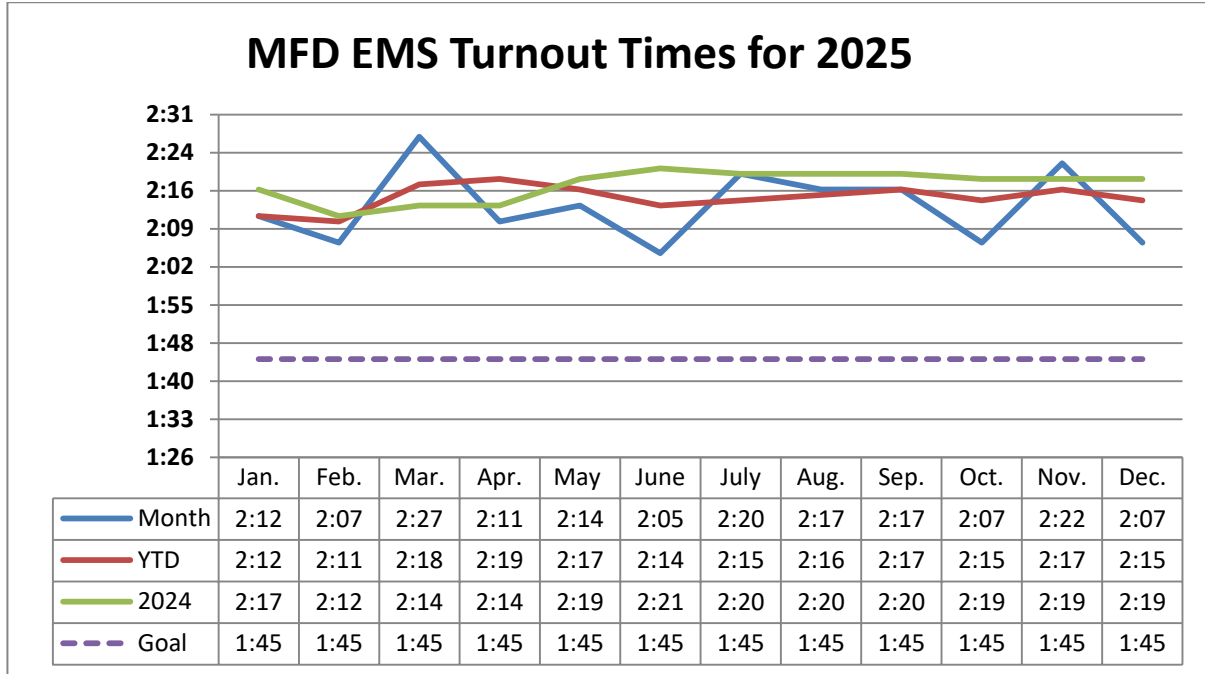

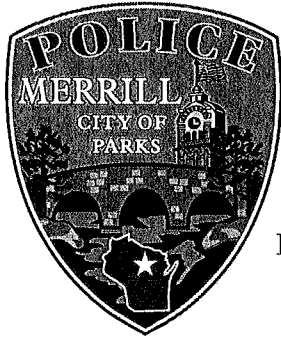
