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## Sec. 20-52. Open burning.

- (a) *Definitions.* The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this section, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this subsection, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

*Open burning* means burning done outside of a building. Open burning is prohibited in the city without first obtaining a permit, with the following exceptions:

- (1) Small outdoor fires used for cooking, or used as part of a public ceremony.
  - (2) Small open fires for welding, acetylene torches, safety flares, heating tar, or similar applications.
  - (3) No burning shall be allowed on, or immediately adjacent to, the surface of any blacktop street or sidewalk.
  - (4) All leaf burning is prohibited, except in areas within the city zoned agricultural.
  - (5) Fire in pits, encircled with nonflammable materials, fire rings or commercially built fire containers with a maximum diameter of 42 inches on residential property and a maximum of 60 inches on commercial property, located at least ten feet from any lot line and any structure. Fires shall be extinguished by 10:00 p.m. Sunday through Thursday and 12:00 a.m. on Fridays and Saturdays or if fires are left unattended or creating a nuisance.
  - (6) Special fires as allowed by permit issued by the fire chief.
- (b) *Substances which may be burned.* The following open burning may be conducted provided a burning permit is first obtained:
- (1) Burning of grass or weeds.
  - (2) Fires set for practice and instruction of firefighters, or the testing of firefighting equipment.
  - (3) The burning of small amounts of dry combustible rubbish, not to include wet combustible rubbish, garbage, oily substances, asphalt, plastic, or rubber products.
  - (4) The burning of trees, wood, limbs, stumps, brush, or leaves, provided, however, that such materials may be burned only in those areas zoned agricultural.
- (c) *Procedures.*
- (1) Before setting or starting any fire, a permit authorizing the setting or starting of such fire shall first be obtained from the fire chief, or from any other person authorized or designated by the fire chief to issue such permits. All open burning conducted pursuant to such duly issued permit shall be performed in a safe, pollution-free manner, when wind and weather conditions are such as to minimize adverse affects, and in conformance with local and state fire protection regulation.
  - (2) The size of the pile of material to be burned shall not exceed four feet in any direction measured horizontally, or three feet measured vertically.
  - (3) The pile of material being burned shall be at least 50 feet away from any structure, wood or lumber pile, wooden fence, tree or bush. Provisions shall be made to prevent the fire from spreading to within 50 feet of such items or the fire shall otherwise be contained in an approved incinerator or burner device which is located at least 15 feet from any structure, wood or lumber pile, wooden fence, tree or bush.
  - (4) Any ashes created by burning such material, as is lawful under this section, are to be disposed of in a manner authorized by law.

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- (5) Open burning shall be constantly attended and supervised by a competent person of at least 16 years of age until such fire is extinguished. This person shall have readily available for use such fire extinguishing equipment as may be necessary for the total control of the fire while burning and/or extinguishing such fire.

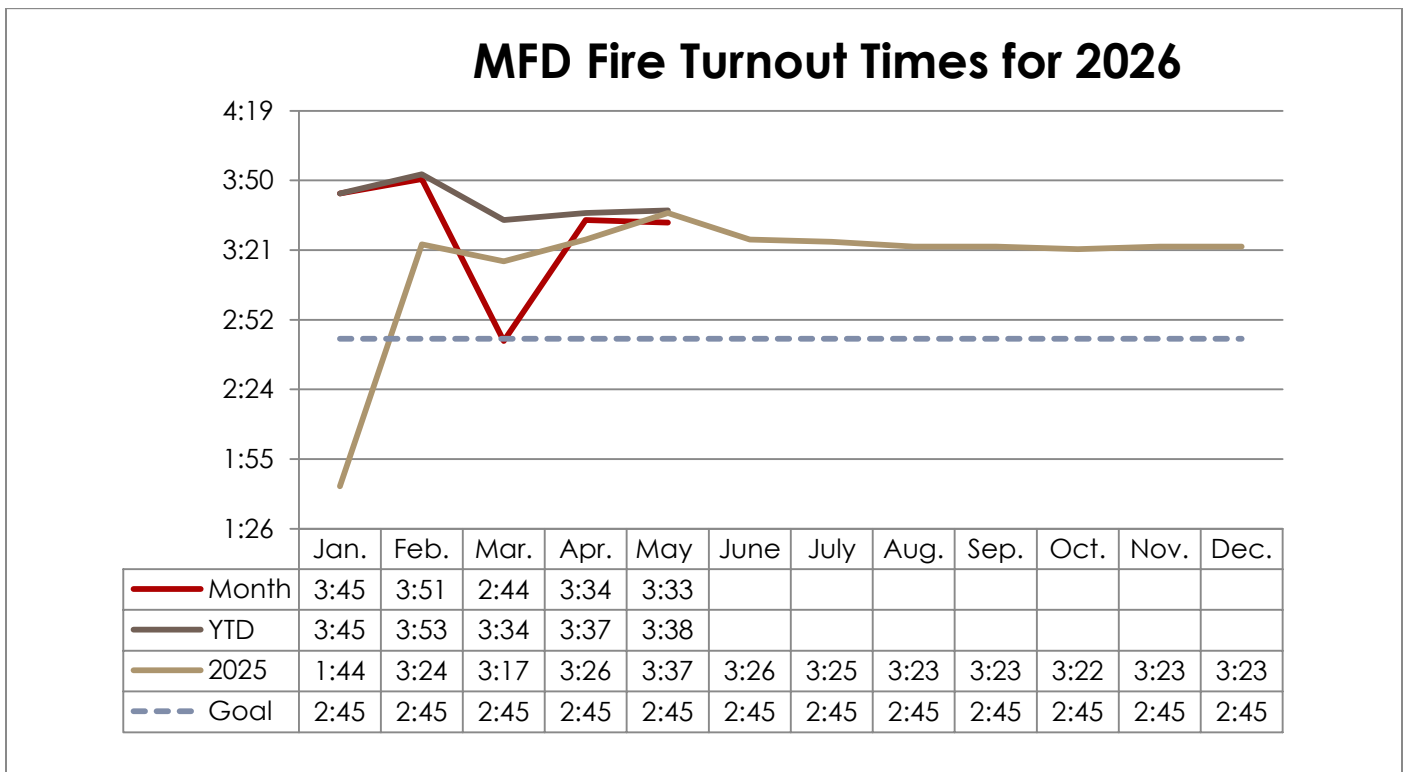
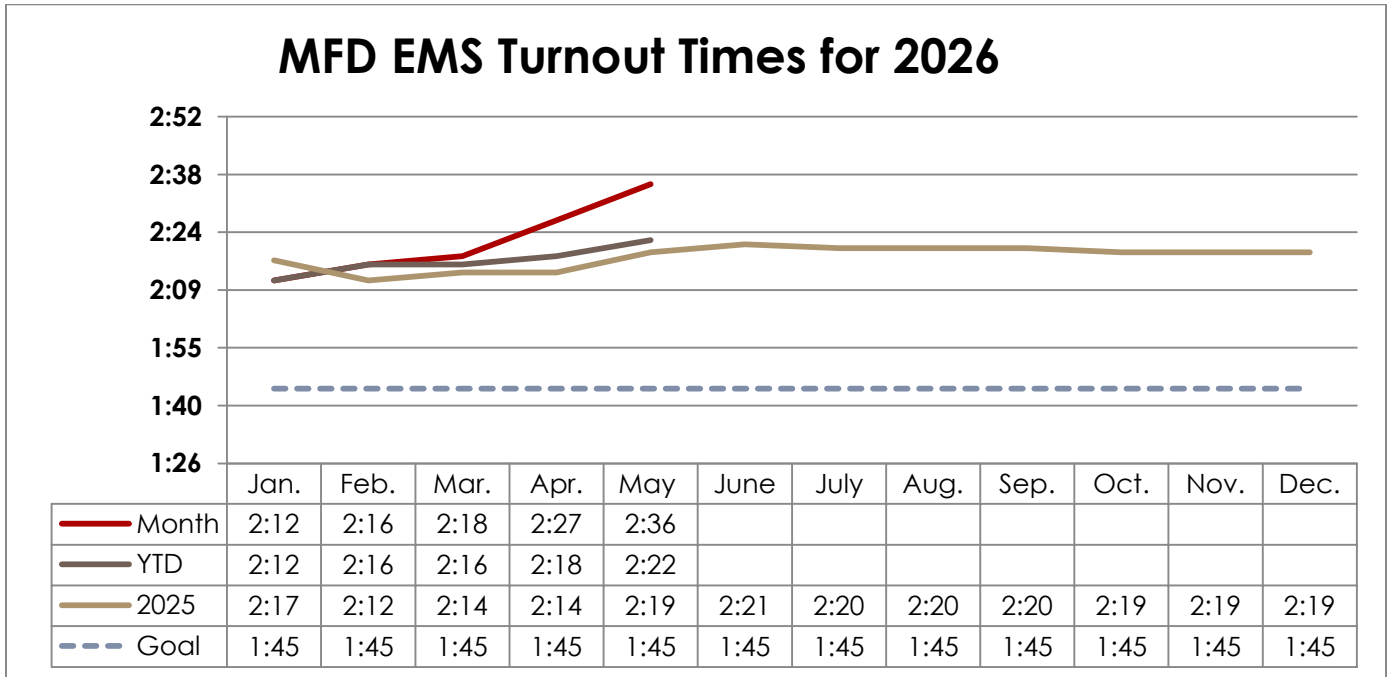

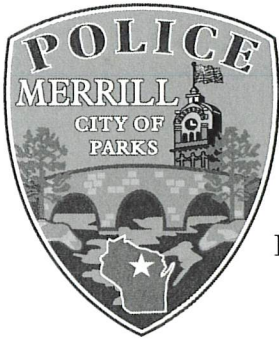

# Shelter Report

## May 2026

### **Animals:**

The animals are doing well. It was a slow month for intakes, although we did have an additional 12 cats brought in from the same house that 41 cats came from in January.

### **Staff:**

Staff is doing well. Jenna will be moving for college and recently gave notice. We have someone hired for every position, including Jenna's. Our payroll will be high compared to what was budgeted but it's unavoidable with so many people training.

### **Events:**

The dog walking class went extremely well! I felt like it was a good mix of answering common questions and teaching some basic safety tips for volunteers. The attendance for the dog walking class was a little disappointing – 4 people canceled last minute. Only 3 of the attendees have come in regularly since the class. We will likely have another class later in summer to enroll additional volunteers.

I would like to create something similar for cat volunteers in the future.

### **Financials:**

We worked with a number of clinics to have almost every cat on the TNR (trap neuter return) list fixed in April & May. After addressing many issues with the current TNR process, we have changed things to put more responsibility on the cat/property owner. The owner must now contribute \$25 to the surgery cost and bring the cat the day the traveling vet clinic is at LCHS. By the time we house & transport the cats, we are spending roughly an additional \$100 per cat. Having the owners transport and care for the cats post-surgery, will save a lot in staff time.

We are now using Volgistics software for volunteer maintenance and scheduling. It has been well received by the volunteers and it saves a lot of staff time. The price is based on the number of active volunteers so we are consistently removing inactive volunteers so it costs less than \$40 each month.
